HOUSE RESOLUTION NO.58

Reps. Zorn, Fink, Alexander, Bezotte, Haadsma, Martin, Schuette and Young offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to declare March 21, 2023, as Abolitionist Day in
- 2 the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, The abolitionist movement was born in the early 18th
- 4 century in order to end the practice of slavery in America and
- 5 around the world; and
- 6 Whereas, Laura Smith Haviland was a trailblazer in the
- 7 American abolitionist movement, fought against injustice, and
- 8 promoted freedom everywhere she went, including her home that is
- 9 now known as Adrian, Michigan; and
- 10 Whereas, Smith Haviland and her family moved to Michigan
- 11 during her young adult life where she would meet others already
- 12 involved in the anti-slavery movement. She soon after lost her

- 1 parents, husband, and child to erysipelas. This kindled her desire
- 2 to devote her life to fighting against the suffering and despair of
- 3 others and from there she turned her energy to the eradication of
- 4 slavery.
- 5 Whereas, The abolitionist movement was made up of many people
- 6 like Laura Smith Haviland who also dedicated their lives to
- 7 irradicating injustice, assisting members of the underground
- 8 railroad, and traveled to many states in pursuit of these missions;
- 9 and
- 10 Whereas, Laura Smith Haviland was inducted into the 2018 Hall
- 11 of Fame class at the National Abolition Hall of Fame in Peterboro,
- 12 NY for her integral role in the anti-slavery movement in Michigan
- 13 and the midwestern United States as a whole. She taught others how
- 14 to confront and obstruct anti-abolition authorities and slave
- 15 catchers in the north. Laura Smith Haviland is responsible for
- 16 freeing and assisting in freeing countless enslaved people during
- 17 her time; and
- 18 Whereas, Laura Smith Haviland continued her work to ensure
- 19 freedom and dignity was afforded to as many people as possible
- 20 throughout her entire life, regardless of the dangers she
- 21 inevitably faced everywhere she went. She possessed a selfless
- 22 attitude, an undying fortitude for justice and bravery; and
- 23 Whereas, We recognize the integral role the abolitionist
- 24 movement made in our nation's history, and moving us closer to true
- 25 equality of life for all Americans; now, therefore, be it
- Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 27 this legislative body declare March 14, 2023, as Abolitionist Day
- 28 in the state of Michigan.
