- 3 Whereas, At least four million children, or five percent of
- 4 the pediatric population, and at least nine million adults, or four
- 5 percent of the adult population, in the United States have
- 6 Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD); and
- 7 Whereas, Research shows that ADHD is the result of an
- 8 imbalance of neurotransmitters in the brain. The primary symptoms
- 9 of ADHD are inattention, impulsiveness, and hyperactivity; and
- 10 Whereas, ADHD has been recognized as a legitimate diagnosis of

- 1 neurological disorder by the American Medical Association, American
- 2 Academy of Pediatrics, the United States Department of Education,
- 3 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the National
- 4 Institute of Mental Health, the American Psychiatric Association
- 5 and the American Academy of Child & Adolescent Psychiatry; now,
- 6 therefore, be it
- 7 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of
- 8 this legislative body declare October 22-28, 2023, as Attention
- 9 Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder Awareness Week in the state of
- 10 Michigan.
