Senators Hertel, McDonald Rivet, Wojno, Shink, Chang, Klinefelt, Huizenga, Santana, Cherry, Singh and Webber offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to designate February 15, 2024, as Angelman
- 2 Syndrome Awareness Day.
- 3 Whereas, Angelman syndrome is a rare neuro-genetic disorder
- 4 that occurs in one in every 15,000 live births or 500,000 people
- 5 worldwide; and
- 6 Whereas, Angelman syndrome shares symptoms and characteristics
- 7 with other disorders including autism, cerebral palsy, and Prader-
- 8 Willi syndrome, often leading to misdiagnosis; and
- 9 Whereas, Individuals diagnosed with Angelman syndrome have
- 10 developmental problems that become noticeable by the age of 6-12

- 1 months; and
- 2 Whereas, Common signs and symptoms usually appear in early
- 3 childhood like walking and balance disorders, gastrointestinal
- 4 issues, seizures, and little to no speech; and
- 5 Whereas, Life expectancy of individuals with Angelman syndrome
- 6 is normal and itself does not cause death; and
- 7 Whereas, Despite its symptoms, people with Angelman syndrome
- 8 have an overall happy and excitable demeanor; and
- 9 Whereas, It is critical for the success of research and
- 10 support services that we raise awareness in the general public and
- 11 the medical community about Angelman syndrome; now, therefore, be

- 14 body designate February 15, 2024, as Angelman Syndrome Awareness
