	Senators Irwin and Geiss offered the following resolution:
1	A resolution to recognize March 2024 as Bleeding Disorders
2	Awareness Month.
3	Whereas, Millions of individuals and thousands of Michiganders
4	are affected not only by hemophilia, but all inheritable bleeding
5	disorders, including Von Willebrand disease, and other rare
6	bleeding disorders; and
7	Whereas, Bleeding disorders, which share the inability to form
8	a proper blood clot, are characterized by extended bleeding after
9	injury, surgery, trauma or menstruation. If not treated
10	effectively, this can lead to significant morbidity and may be
11	fatal; and
12	Whereas, During the 1980s, many individuals with hemophilia

- 1 became infected with HIV and Hepatitis C due to the contamination
- 2 of blood supply and products; and
- 3 Whereas, In 1986, March was federally designated as
- 4 "Hemophilia Awareness Month," and in 2016, the Department of Health
- 5 and Human Services designated March as "National Bleeding Disorders
- 6 Month"; and
- 7 Whereas, There has been great scientific achievements in the
- 8 treatment of bleeding disorders and the larger pursuit of advanced
- 9 therapies and cures to these disorders; and
- 10 Whereas, The bleeding disorders community's relationships with
- 11 policymakers foster numerous medical and policy advancements
- 12 beneficial to all those affected and their loved ones; and
- 13 Whereas, Bleeding Disorders Awareness Month fosters a greater
- 14 sense of community and shared purpose among individuals with
- 15 inheritable bleeding disorders; now, therefore, be it
- 16 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 17 body recognize March 2024 as Bleeding Disorders Awareness Month;
- 18 and be it further
- 19 Resolved, That we raise awareness of and engagement in the
- 20 inheritable bleeding disorders journey beyond our community to the
- 21 general public, enabling the prevention of illness, unnecessary
- 22 procedures, and disability.
