SENATE RESOLUTION NO.119

Senators Lauwers, Theis, Bellino, Huizenga, Johnson, Lindsey, Nesbitt, Webber and Wojno offered the following resolution:

- 1 A resolution to recognize May 12-18, 2024, as Police Week.
- 2 Whereas, In 1962, President John F. Kennedy proclaimed May
- 3 15th as National Peace Officers Memorial Day, while the calendar
- 4 week in which May 15th falls is also known as National Police Week;
- 5 and
- 6 Whereas, National Police Week was established by a joint
- 7 resolution of Congress in 1962, paying special recognition to those
- 8 law enforcement officers who lost their lives in the line of duty
- 9 or for the safety and protection of others; and
- 10 Whereas, There are more than 700,000 law enforcement officers
- 11 serving in communities across the United States, including the

- 1 approximately 17,000 full-time uniformed police officers in
- 2 Michigan; and
- 3 Whereas, Members of law enforcement deserve the appreciation
- 4 and respect of our citizens for the merit, dignity, bravery, and
- 5 reliability they exhibit each and every day. We must also honor the
- 6 sacrifices made by families of police officers, as each day they
- 7 must face constant concern as their loved ones work to protect us;
- 8 and
- 9 Whereas, In 2023, 125 law enforcement officers were killed and
- 10 many more assaulted in the line of duty across the country. The
- 11 names of these dedicated public servants who made the ultimate
- 12 sacrifice are engraved on the walls of the National Law Enforcement
- 13 Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C.; and
- 14 Whereas, Michigan's fallen officers will never be forgotten,
- 15 nor will their service to their respective communities. By choosing
- 16 to serve as law enforcement officers, these courageous individuals
- 17 answered the call for service and willingly put their lives in
- 18 jeopardy to protect; and
- 19 Whereas, We applaud them for recognizing service as their
- 20 honorable career, securing the public safety, and commend those who
- 21 serve without incident to date; and
- 22 Whereas, Michigan citizens have turned to members of law
- 23 enforcement for assistance and support in times of distress,
- 24 whether they are coping with a personal crisis, bearing the strains
- 25 of a pandemic, or struggling through civil disorder or a natural
- 26 disaster; and
- Whereas, Our communities rely on these courageous individuals
- 28 when it is difficult to stand on our own. We are indebted to the
- 29 unwavering public service of our local and state police and are

- 1 both fortunate and grateful for the contributions of law
- 2 enforcement officers to the people of Michigan; now, therefore, be

- 4 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 5 body commemorate May 12-18, 2024, as Police Week. We openly salute
- 6 the law enforcement officers in our communities, in addition to
- 7 those in our state and country, and honor police who sacrifice
- 8 their lives for the safety and security of all.
