- 7 small oil lamps and place them around the home. The lighting of the
- 8 lamps is followed by prayers for attainment of health, wealth,
- 9 knowledge, peace, and valor, and is recognized as the beginning of
- 10 a new year for some Hindus; and

         Whereas, For Hindus, Diwali is a celebration of the belief
    that light triumphs over darkness and good triumphs over evil; and

         Whereas, For Sikhs, Diwali is feted as the day that the sixth

    founding Sikh Guru, or revered teacher, Guru Hargobind, was

    released from captivity by the Mughal Emperor Jehangir; and

         Whereas, For Jains, Diwali marks the anniversary of the

    attainment of moksha or liberation by Lord Mahavira, the last of

    the Tirthankaras, who was the great teacher of Jain Dharma at the

    end of his life in 527 B.C.; and
         Whereas, Michigan remains resolute in its commitment to

    fostering diversity of experience and religious acceptance; and

         Whereas, Diwali is a time marked by qualities of togetherness,

    family, and community; now, therefore, be it
