A resolution to declare February 28, 2023, as Rare Disease Day in the state of Michigan.

Whereas, There are approximately 7,000 diseases and conditions considered rare (each affecting fewer than 200,000 Americans in the United States), according to the National Institutes of Health (NIH); and

Whereas, While each of these diseases may affect small numbers of people, rare diseases as a group affect almost 30 million

Americans and thousands of Michigan residents; and

Whereas, Many rare diseases are chronic, progressive, and debilitating, significantly impacting the lives of those affected;

Whereas, While more than 800 drugs and biologics have been

- 6 finding medical experts, and lack of access to treatments or
- 7 ancillary services; and
- 8 Whereas, The rare disease community is often underrepresented
- 9 in funding, research, clinical trials, and advocacy efforts, with
- 10 much of the burden to raise public awareness and support placed on
- those affected; and
- 12 Whereas, The National Organization for Rare Disorders (NORD)
- 13 is organizing a nationwide observance of Rare Disease Day on
- **14** February 28, 2023; and
- 15 Whereas, Thousands of patients, caregivers, medical
- 16 professionals, researchers, pharmaceutical companies, and others in
- 17 Michigan will participate in this observance; now, therefore, be it
