1 A resolution to declare April 17-21, 2023, as National Work 2 Zone Awareness Week in the state of Michigan. 3 Whereas, According to the Michigan Department of Transportation, there were 5,814 total work zone crashes, 65 4 serious injuries and 20 fatalities in our state in 2021. This is 5 6 slightly higher than the deaths in previous years; and 7 Whereas, The Federal Highway Administration says that in 2020, 8 the most recent year for which statistics are available throughout 9 the country, 857 people were killed nationwide in work zones- a 1.4 percent increase from 2019.
