- 1 A resolution to declare February 15, 2024, as Angelman
- 2 Syndrome Awareness Day in the state of Michigan.
- 3 Whereas, Angelman syndrome is a rare neuro-genetic disorder
- 4 that occurs in one in 15,000 live births or 500,000 people
- 5 worldwide; and
- 6 Whereas, Angelman syndrome shares symptoms and characteristics
- 7 with other disorders including autism, cerebral palsy, and Prader-

Willi syndrome, often leading to misdiagnosis; and 1 2 Whereas, People with Angelman syndrome have developmental 3 problems that become noticeable by the age of 6 - 12 months; and 4 Whereas, Common signs and symptoms usually appear in early childhood like walking and balance disorders, gastrointestinal 5 6 issues, seizures, and little to no speech; and 7 Whereas, Life expectancy of people with Angelman syndrome is 8 normal and itself does not cause death; and 9 Whereas, Despite its symptoms, people with Angelman syndrome 10 have an overall happy and excitable demeanor; and 11 Whereas, It is critical to the success of research and support 12 services to raise awareness in the general public and the medical 13 community about Angelman syndrome; now, therefore, be it 14 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of 15 this legislative body declare February 15, 2024, as Angelman 16 Syndrome Awareness Day in the state of Michigan. We encourage all

citizens to join in the observance.

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
