| 3  | Whereas, According to the American Childhood Cancer                 |
| 4  | Organization, an estimated 15,780 children between the ages of      |
| 5  | birth through 19 are diagnosed with cancer each year; and           |
| 6  | Whereas, In 2023 alone, an estimated 9,910 new cases have been      |
| 7  | diagnosed; and  |
| 8  | Whereas, Our goal is to increase awareness about childhood          |
| 9  | cancer, which is the leading cause of death by disease for children |
| 10 | under the age of 14; and  |
| 11 | Whereas, We honor the extraordinary resilience, courage, and        |
| 12 | strength of those who this harmful disease has effected; and        |

- 1 Whereas, Children's cancer affects all ethnic, gender, and 2 socio-economic groups; and
- 3 Whereas, Since the mid-1970s, advancements have been made in
- 4 the fight against childhood cancer. Due to major treatment strides
- 5 in recent decades, more than 80 percent of children with cancer now
- 6 survive five years or more; and
- 7 Whereas, Increased awareness, support, and research will help
- 8 to further improve outcomes and protect children from these serious
- 9 diseases; and
- 10 Whereas, We must renew our commitment to curing childhood
- 11 cancer and offer our support to the brave young people who are
- 12 fighting this disease; and
- 13 Whereas, To honor the memory of every young person lost to
- 14 cancer, we must unite behind improved treatment, advanced research
- 15 and data, and brighter futures for young people; and
- 16 Whereas, We recognize the amazing strength, perseverance, and
- 17 optimism of the families and friends of children who suffer from
- 18 these devastating illnesses; and
- 19 Whereas, We acknowledge the medical professionals,
- 20 researchers, and others who dedicate their time to search for new
- 21 and safer treatments and cures; and
- 22 Whereas, All children deserve the chance to be healthy and
- 23 find joy and fulfillment in their childhoods, as they deserve the
- 24 chance to realize their full potential and grow into adults; now,
- 25 therefore, be it

- 27 body designate September 2023 as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month.
