SENATE RESOLUTION NO.116

Senator Moss offered the following resolution: 1 A resolution to recognize May 5-6, 2024, as Holocaust 2 Remembrance Day. 3 Whereas, The horrors of the Holocaust should never be forgotten. The Holocaust was the state-sponsored systematic 4 persecution and annihilation of European Jewry by Nazi Germany and 5 its collaborators from 1933-1945; and 6 7 Whereas, The Holocaust resulted in the extermination of six million Jews and their potential decedents. The world's Jewish 8 9 population was reduced by one-third; and Whereas, Poland, home to the largest Jewish community before 10 World War II, lost 90 percent of its Jewish population. Greece, 11 12 Yugoslavia, Hungary, Lithuania, Bohemia, the Netherlands, Slovakia,

1 and Latvia each lost more than 70 percent of their Jewish 2 population; and Whereas, Millions more suffered grievous oppression and death 3 under Nazi tyranny based on their religion, including Catholic 4 priests, Christian pastors, and Jehovah's Witnesses; their national 5 6 origin, including Poles, Soviets, Ukrainians and Sorbs; their 7 ethnicity and culture, including the Romani people; their political beliefs, including courageous resisters and government dissidents; 8 9 their physical appearance, including those with disabilities; and 10 their sexual orientation and gender identity; and 11 Whereas, The same conspiracies, hatred, and acts of cruelty against Jews still persist today. On October 7, 2023, 1,200 Jews 12 and others in Israel were slaughtered and hundreds more were taken 13 14 hostage, including survivors of the Holocaust. This was the single 15 most violent event targeting Jews since 1945 and unleashed public displays of Jewish hatred not seen in generations; and 16 17 Whereas, In 2023, The Anti-Defamation League (ADL) reported 18 that antisemitic incidents increased 140 percent, including an 19 increase in assaults by 45 percent, harassment by 184 percent, and 20 acts of vandalism by 69 percent. This data amounts to the highest level of antisemitism in the 45 years these incidents have been 21 tracked, as well as a significant increase over 2022 which set the 22 23 previous record for antisemitic incidents; and 24 Whereas, The history of the Holocaust must instruct the moral 25 and ethical responsibilities of individuals, societies, and 26 government when confronting antisemitism. It serves as an important

reminder of what can happen when we allow bigotry, hatred, and indifference to enter and conquer our societies in moments of peril for Jewish populations. These lessons must not expire; and

- 1 Whereas, The state of Michigan, through PA 170 of 2016,
- 2 requires that the social studies curriculum for grades 8 to 12
- 3 includes age- and grade-appropriate instruction about genocide so
- 4 students learn about past atrocities, factually and
- 5 comprehensively. This education provides future generations the
- 6 tools to ensure the evils in history are not repeated; now,
- 7 therefore, be it
- 8 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative
- 9 body recognize May 5-6, 2024, as Holocaust Remembrance Day; and be
- 10 it further
- 11 Resolved, That in honor of the victims of the Holocaust, the
- 12 survivors, and their liberators, the citizens of Michigan should
- 13 reflect upon this terrible event and strive to overcome hatred and
- 14 intolerance through both learning and remembrance.
