## SENATE RESOLUTION NO.123

	Senator Wojno offered the following resolution:
1	A resolution to commemorate the 80th anniversary of D-Day.
2	Whereas, On June 6, 1944, approximately 156,000 Allied troops
3	landed along a heavily fortified stretch of French coastline,
4	seeking to breach Fortress Europe and strike a crucial blow against
5	the fascism of Nazi Germany; and
6	Whereas, D-Day, code named "Operation Overlord", was fought
7	along the beaches of Normandy so that Europe might be free from the
8	bonds of tyranny and oppression; and
9	Whereas, More than 5,000 ships and 11,000 aircraft supported
10	the invasion, making D-Day the largest naval, air, and land
11	operation ever undertaken; and
12	Whereas, These soldiers, many of whom were not even 20 years

- 1 old, faced a daunting and perilous task as they fought through the
- 2 ocean surf, braving artillery shells and machine gun fire with
- 3 little to no natural cover to protect against enemy guns; and
- 4 Whereas, Allied forces suffered more than 10,000 casualties
- 5 that day with over 4,000 Allied soldiers making the ultimate
- 6 sacrifice, laying down their lives on the beachheads of France.
- 7 Many sons of America were laid to rest in the graveyards of Europe,
- 8 young lives cut short before their time, thousands of miles from
- 9 home; and
- 10 Whereas, The brave men who waged battle on the Normandy coast
- 11 represent the best of mankind, embodied by a love of country, a
- 12 dedication to humanity, and, above all else, a profound and
- 13 steadfast devotion to the causes of liberty and freedom; and
- 14 Whereas, All those American soldiers are testaments to
- 15 America's enduring promise to forever stand tall against tyrannical
- 16 governments, to always protect and defend democracy, and to never
- 17 forget that our nation and all great nations were built upon the
- 18 principles of freedom; and
- 19 Whereas, We must always remember and honor the men who fought
- 20 and died on that day, both those who returned home as heroes,
- 21 husbands, and fathers, and also those whom history called to their
- 22 final breath on Normandy sands; and
- 23 Whereas, The world owes a debt of gratitude to the members of
- 24 the "Greatest Generation" who assumed the task of freeing the world
- 25 from Nazi and fascist regimes and restoring liberty in Europe; and
- 26 Whereas, Michiganders, realizing full well that words ring
- 27 hollow in honoring the bravery, valiance, and courage of these men,
- 28 seek to honor their memories; now, therefore, be it
- 29 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative

- 1 body commemorate the 80th anniversary of D-Day; and be it further
- 2 Resolved, That we encourage all Michiganders to observe the
- 3 anniversary of D-Day and to forever honor those souls whose eulogy
- 4 will always be a free and democratic Europe.
