### SUMMARY:

House Bill 4345 would amend the State School Aid Act to exempt a district from meeting the minimum of 1,098 hours and 180 days of pupil instruction if that district meets the following:

- The district is located wholly or partially in a county covered by a state of emergency declared by the governor.
- A majority of the district's board votes to exempt the district from the minimum hours and days of pupil instruction requirement.
- The board's vote exempts the district from providing only the hours and days of pupil instruction actually missed due to the state of emergency.

MCL 388.1701

### FISCAL IMPACT:

The bill would have no fiscal impact on the state and would likely have an indeterminate, but minimal, impact on certain local school districts and public school academies (PSAs). The bill could create some savings for certain districts and PSAs by waiving days of instruction and the corresponding number of hours of instruction that would have to be added at the end of the school year, thus eliminating the additional utility, food service, and transportation costs.
