AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT

1. Purses and Supplements – Fairs/Licensed Tracks

Includes authorization for the department to receive an additional \$2.0 million from the Agriculture Equine Industry Development Fund to be used for purses for standardbred harness horse races offered by fairs and races at licensed pari-mutuel racetracks. If there is no standardbred race meeting licensee, funding can be designated for races run at a county fair exclusively for 2- and 3-year-old Michigan sired standardbred horses.
