Senate Bill 234 (Substitute S-1 as reported)

CONTENT

The bill would amend the Revised School Code to require the board of a school district or board of directors of a public school academy to create, implement, and enforce a policy seeking to limit student cellphone use at its schools, beginning with the 2025-26 school year.

Proposed MCL 380.1304

BRIEF RATIONALE

Many K-12 students carry technology into the classroom; however, phones, tablets, and smartwatches may distract students from their education. According to a recent survey conducted by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES), more than two-thirds of public school leaders felt that cellphones had negatively affected their students' mental health (72%) and attention spans (73%). Fifty-three percent responded that cellphone usage hampered their students' academic performance overall.¹ Accordingly, it has been suggested that students' access to cellphones and other wireless technologies be limited while in school.
