HOUSE BILL NO. 4151

February 26, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Martin, Kuhn, Schuette, DeBoyer, Steele, St. Germaine, Thompson, Schmaltz, Tisdel, Cavitt, Greene and Kelly and referred to Committee on Education and Workforce.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1531 (MCL 380.1531), as amended by 2023 PA 110.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1531. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the
- 2 superintendent of public instruction shall determine the
- 3 requirements for and issue all licenses, certificates, and
- 4 endorsements for teachers, including preprimary teachers and
- 5 teachers as counselors, in the public schools of this state.
- 6 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the

- superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching certificate or additional endorsement only to an individual who has passed appropriate available examinations. The superintendent of public instruction may accept passage of an equivalent examination approved by the superintendent of public instruction to meet this requirement for an individual holding a teaching certificate from another state, country, or federally recognized Indian tribe.
- 8 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this act, the 9 superintendent of public instruction shall only issue a teaching 10 certificate only to an individual who has met the elementary or 11 secondary, as applicable, reading credit requirements established under superintendent of public instruction rule. If an individual 12 holds a teaching certificate, notwithstanding any rule to the 1.3 contrary, the superintendent of public instruction shall not 14 15 advance the individual's certification to professional 16 certification unless the individual has successfully completed at least a 3-credit course of study with appropriate field experiences 17 in the diagnosis and remediation of reading disabilities and 18 differentiated instruction. To meet this requirement, the course of 19 20 study should include the following elements, as determined by the department to be appropriate for the individual's certification 21 22 level and endorsements: interest inventories, English language 23 learning screening, visual and auditory discrimination tools, 24 language expression and processing screening, phonemics, phonics, 25 vocabulary, fluency, comprehension, spelling and writing assessment tools, and instructional strategies. An individual may complete the 26 27 course of study as part of his or her the individual's teacher 28 preparation program.
 - (4) Any revisions to existing reading standards must include

- 1 the recognition of reading disorders and enable teachers to make
- 2 referrals for instruction and support for pupils with reading
- 3 disorders.
- 4 (5) Subject to subsection (8), if an individual holding a
- 5 teaching certificate from another state, country, or federally
- 6 recognized Indian tribe applies to the superintendent of public
- 7 instruction for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets the
- 8 requirements of this subsection, the superintendent of public
- 9 instruction shall issue to the individual a Michigan teaching
- 10 certificate and endorsements comparable to those the individual
- 11 holds in the other state or country or with the federally
- 12 recognized Indian tribe without requiring the individual to pass
- 13 the appropriate examinations otherwise required under subsection
- 14 (2) or to complete the reading credit requirement established under
- 15 superintendent of public instruction rule as described in
- 16 subsection (3). To be eligible to receive a Michigan teaching
- 17 certificate under this subsection, an individual shall provide
- 18 evidence satisfactory to the department that he or she the
- 19 individual has taught successfully for at least 3 years in a
- 20 position for which the individual's teaching certification from the
- 21 other state, country, or federally recognized Indian tribe was
- 22 valid.
- 23 (6) Subject to subsection (8), an individual holding a
- 24 teaching certificate from another state, country, or federally
- 25 recognized Indian tribe is eligible for a Michigan professional
- 26 education certificate if the individual meets both of the
- 27 following:
- 28 (a) The individual has taught successfully for at least 3
- 29 years in a position for which the individual's teaching

- 1 certification from the other state, country, or federally 2 recognized Indian tribe was valid.
- 3 (b) The individual meets the elementary or secondary, as 4 applicable, reading credit requirement established under 5 superintendent of public instruction rule as described in 6 subsection (3).
- (7) Subject to subsection (8), if an individual holding a 7 8 teaching certificate from another state, country, or federally 9 recognized Indian tribe applies to the superintendent of public 10 instruction for an additional endorsement on a valid Michigan 11 teaching certificate and meets the requirements of this subsection, the superintendent of public instruction shall issue the individual 12 an endorsement comparable to that which the individual holds in the 1.3 14 other state or country or with the federally recognized Indian 15 tribe without requiring that the individual pass the appropriate 16 available examinations otherwise required under subsection (2). To 17 be eligible to receive an additional endorsement under this 18 subsection, an individual shall provide evidence satisfactory to the department that he or she the individual has taught 19 20 successfully for at least 3 years in a position for which the 21 individual's teaching endorsement from the other state, country, or 22 federally recognized Indian tribe is valid.
 - (8) The superintendent of public instruction shall deny a Michigan teaching certificate or endorsement to an individual described in subsection (5), (6), or (7) for fraud, material misrepresentation, or concealment in the individual's application for a certificate or for a conviction for which an individual's teaching certificate may be suspended or revoked under section 1535a.

- (9) For the purposes of this section, the superintendent of 1 2 public instruction, based upon on criteria recommended by a committee of teachers, representatives of approved teacher 3 education institutions, Michigan education organizations and 4 5 associations, and experts in measurement and assessment, shall 6 develop, select, or develop and select 1 or more subject area examinations. In addition, the superintendent of public 8 instruction, based upon on criteria recommended by the committee 9 described in this subsection, shall approve a reading subtest to be 10 taken and passed by individuals seeking pre-K to grade 3 or grade 3 11 to grade 6-level endorsement. If the department develops for use 12 under this subsection an examination that had previously been contracted for using a competitive bid process, then the department 1.3 14 shall not expend on the development of that examination an amount 15 that exceeds the amount that the department expended on procurement 16 of the most recent competitively-bid version of that examination. The competitive bid process must address validity, reliability, and 17 other technical standards of the examinations and of the 18 appropriate administration and use of those examinations. 19
 - (10) Not later than November 30 of each year, the superintendent of public instruction shall submit in writing a report on the development or selection and use of the subject area examinations to the house and senate education committees. The report must also contain a financial statement regarding revenue received from the assessment of fees levied under subsection (12) (13) and the amount of and any purposes for which that revenue was expended.
- 28 (11) The examinations required by this section may be taken at 29 different times during an approved teacher preparation program, but

- the examinations, as applicable, must be passed before an individual is recommended for certification.
 - (12) The superintendent of public instruction shall issue an additional endorsement for a subject area to an individual who has passed the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification for that subject area.
- 7 (13) (12)—The department, or if approved by the superintendent 8 of public instruction, a private testing service, may assess fees 9 for taking the appropriate available examinations described in 10 subsection (2). The fees $\frac{1}{2}$ which must be set by the superintendent 11 of public instruction, and must not exceed the actual cost of the examination and of administering the examination. Fees received by 12 the department must be expended solely for administrative expenses 1.3 14 that it incurs in implementing this section. If the superintendent 15 of public instruction increases a fee charged for an examination 16 under this subsection, at least 1 year before implementing the fee increase, the department shall notify each approved teacher 17 education institution of the amount of the fee increase. An 18 19 approved teacher education institution shall notify each of its 20 affected students of the timing and amount of such a fee increase.
 - (14) (13)—If an individual holding a teaching certificate from another state, country, or federally recognized Indian tribe applies for a Michigan teaching certificate and meets all requirements for the Michigan teaching certificate except passage of the appropriate available examinations under subsection (2) or the reading credit requirement under subsection (3), the superintendent of public instruction shall issue a nonrenewable temporary teaching certificate, good for 1 year, to the individual. The superintendent of public instruction shall not issue a Michigan
