A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding section 18223a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 18223a. (1) Until 180 days after the effective date of
- 2 the amendatory act that added this section, except for duties
- 3 performed as an employee of a governmental entity or of a nonprofit
- 4 organization serving benevolent and charitable purposes, the board
- 5 shall place 1 limitation on a license granted to an individual

- under section 18223(2). The limitation must require supervision by a psychologist who has a license other than a limited license.
- 3 (2) Beginning 180 days after the effective date of the
- 4 amendatory act that added this section, except as otherwise
- 5 provided in this subsection, 1 limitation must be placed on a
- 6 limited license granted to an individual under section 18223(2).
- 7 The limitation must require supervision by a psychologist who has a
- 8 license other than a limited license. The limitation described in
- 9 this subsection does not apply to an individual who is granted a
- 10 limited license under section 18223(2) while the individual is
- 11 performing duties as an employee of a governmental entity or of a
- 12 nonprofit organization serving benevolent and charitable purposes
- 13 if either of the following circumstances applies:
- 14 (a) The individual is not diagnosing a patient with an autism 15 spectrum disorder.
- 16 (b) If the individual is diagnosing a patient with an autism
 17 spectrum disorder, the individual has held the limited license
 18 under section 18223(2) for not less than 3 years.
- 19 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 20 unless Senate Bill No. (request no. S00384'25) or House Bill
- 21 No. (request no. H00384'25) of the 103rd Legislature is
- 22 enacted into law.
