

# HOUSE BILL NO. 4194

March 11, 2025, Introduced by Reps. T. Carter, Fitzgerald, Rheingans, Wegela, Wilson, Tate, Pohutsky, Weiss, Breen, Rogers, Myers-Phillips, Edwards, Skaggs, Longjohn, Hoskins, Steckloff, Tsernoglou, Wooden and Glanville and referred to Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 222, entitled

"An act to provide for an official personal identification card; to provide for its form, issuance and use; to regulate the use and disclosure of information obtained from the card; to prescribe the powers and duties of the secretary of state; to prescribe fees; to prescribe certain penalties for violations; and to provide an appropriation for certain purposes,"

by amending sections 1, 1a, and 2 (MCL 28.291, 28.291a, and 28.292), section 1 as amended by 2023 PA 261, section 1a as amended by 2020 PA 306, and section 2 as amended by 2021 PA 73.

## **THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

**1**        Sec. 1. (1) An individual who is a resident of this state may

1 apply to the secretary of state for an official state personal  
2 identification card. Upon application, the applicant shall ~~supply~~  
3 **provide** a photographic identity document, a birth certificate or  
4 other nonphotographic identity document, and other sufficient  
5 documents as the secretary of state may ~~require~~**allow** to verify the  
6 identity ~~and citizenship~~ of the applicant. ~~If an applicant for an~~  
7 ~~official state personal identification card is not a citizen of the~~  
8 ~~United States, the applicant shall supply a photographic identity~~  
9 ~~document and other sufficient documents to verify the identity of~~  
10 ~~the applicant and the applicant's legal presence in the United~~  
11 ~~States under subsection (5). The documents required under this~~  
12 ~~subsection must include the applicant's full legal name, date of~~  
13 ~~birth, address, and residency and demonstrate that the applicant is~~  
14 ~~a citizen of the United States or is legally present in the United~~  
15 ~~States. If the applicant's full legal name differs from the name of~~  
16 ~~the applicant that appears on a document presented under this~~  
17 ~~subsection, the applicant shall present documents to verify the~~  
18 ~~applicant's current full legal name. An application for an official~~  
19 state personal identification card must be made in a manner  
20 prescribed by the secretary of state and must contain the  
21 applicant's full legal name, date of birth, residence address,  
22 height, sex, eye color, signature, intent to be an organ donor,  
23 other information required or permitted on the official state  
24 personal identification card and, only to the extent to comply with  
25 federal law, the applicant's Social Security number. The applicant  
26 may provide a mailing address if the applicant receives mail at an  
27 address different from the applicant's residence address. ~~Beginning~~  
28 ~~June 27, 2021, if~~**If** the applicant is a program participant in the  
29 address confidentiality program under the address confidentiality

1 program act, 2020 PA 301, MCL 780.851 to 780.873, the applicant  
2 shall ~~present~~**provide** to the secretary of state the applicant's  
3 participation card issued under the address confidentiality program  
4 act, 2020 PA 301, MCL 780.851 to 780.873. Only for voter  
5 registration transactions under section 493a(6) of the Michigan  
6 election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.493a, an applicant for an  
7 official state personal identification card must indicate on the  
8 application or change of address application whether the applicant  
9 is a citizen of the United States. Only for voter registration  
10 transactions under section 493a(6) of the Michigan election law,  
11 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.493a, an application must allow the applicant  
12 to indicate that the applicant declines to use the application as a  
13 voter registration application.

14 (2) The secretary of state shall accept as 1 of the  
15 identification documents required under subsection (1) an  
16 identification card issued by the department of corrections to  
17 prisoners who are placed on parole or released from a correctional  
18 facility, containing the prisoner's legal name, photograph, and  
19 other information identifying the prisoner as provided in section  
20 37(4) of the corrections code of 1953, 1953 PA 232, MCL 791.237.

21 (3) The secretary of state shall have electronic access to  
22 prisoner information maintained by the department of corrections  
23 for the purpose of verifying the identity of a prisoner who applies  
24 for an official state identification card under subsection (1).

25 (4) The secretary of state shall not issue an official state  
26 personal identification card to an individual who holds an  
27 operator's or chauffeur's license issued under the Michigan vehicle  
28 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923, unless the license has  
29 been suspended, revoked, or restricted.

~~(5) If the applicant is not a citizen of the United States, the applicant shall provide, and the department shall verify, documents demonstrating the applicant's legal presence in the United States. Nothing in this act obligates this state to comply with title II of the real ID act of 2005, Public Law 109-13. The secretary of state may adopt rules under the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, as are necessary for the administration of this subsection. A determination by the secretary of state that an applicant is not legally present in the United States may be appealed under section 631 of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.631. The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal identification card to an applicant described in this subsection for a term that exceeds the duration of the applicant's legal presence in the United States.~~

(5) ~~(6)~~—The secretary of state shall not disclose a Social Security number obtained under subsection (1) to another person except ~~for use for~~ **under** 1 or more of the following purposes:**circumstances:**

(a) ~~Compliance~~ **For compliance** with 49 USC 31301 to 31317 and regulations and rules related to this act.

(b) To carry out the purposes of section 466(a) of the social security act, 42 USC 666, in connection with matters relating to paternity, child support, or overdue child support.

(c) ~~To~~ **For** the department of health and human services ~~, for comparison to compare~~ with vital records maintained by the department of health and human services under part 28 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.2801 to 333.2899.

(d) As otherwise required by law.

(6) ~~(7)~~—The secretary of state shall not display an individual's Social Security number on the individual's official state personal identification card.

(7) ~~(8)~~—A requirement under this section to include a Social Security number on an application does not apply to an applicant who demonstrates that the applicant is exempt under law from obtaining **or is otherwise unable to obtain** a Social Security number.

~~(9) The secretary of state, with the approval of the state administrative board created under 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.1 to 17.3, may enter into agreements with the United States government to verify whether an applicant for an official state personal identification card under this section who is not a citizen of the United States is authorized under federal law to be present in the United States.~~

(8) ~~(10)~~—The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal identification card to an individual holding an official state personal identification card issued by another state without confirmation that the individual is terminating or has terminated the official state personal identification card issued by the other state.

(9) ~~(11)~~—The secretary of state shall do all of the following:

(a) Ensure the physical security of locations where official state personal identification cards are produced and the security of document materials and papers from which official state personal identification cards are produced.

(b) Subject each person authorized to manufacture or produce official state personal identification cards and each person ~~who~~ **that** has the ability to affect the identity information that appears on official state personal identification cards to

1 appropriate security clearance requirements. The security  
2 requirements of this subdivision and subdivision (a) may require  
3 that official state personal identification cards be manufactured  
4 or produced in this state.

5 (c) Provide fraudulent document recognition programs to  
6 secretary of state employees engaged in the issuance of official  
7 state personal identification cards.

8 (10) ~~(12)~~ If an individual meets the requirements under  
9 subsection ~~(13)~~, ~~(11)~~, ~~beginning July 1, 2021,~~ the secretary of  
10 state shall allow the individual to elect a communication  
11 impediment designation on the application maintained in the central  
12 file under section 7 or in another appropriate system that limits  
13 access to an individual allowed access to public record information  
14 by the criminal justice information policy council under the  
15 C.J.I.S. policy council act, 1974 PA 163, MCL 28.211 to 28.215, and  
16 that allows an individual with access to view a communication  
17 impediment designation with an official state personal  
18 identification card.

19 (11) ~~(13)~~ An individual seeking an election for a  
20 communication impediment designation under subsection ~~(12)~~ ~~(10)~~  
21 shall provide the secretary of state a certification that meets all  
22 of the following **requirements**:

23 (a) Is signed by a physician, physician assistant, certified  
24 nurse practitioner, audiologist, speech-language pathologist,  
25 psychologist, or physical therapist licensed to practice in this  
26 state.

27 (b) Identifies the individual for whom the communication  
28 impediment designation is being elected.

29 (c) Attests to the nature of the health condition that may

1 impede communication.

2       (12) ~~(14)~~—The secretary of state shall not display an  
3 individual's communication impediment designation on the  
4 individual's official state personal identification card.

5       (13) ~~(15)~~—An individual who intentionally makes a false  
6 statement of material fact or commits or attempts to commit a  
7 deception or fraud on a statement described under subsection ~~(13)~~  
8 **(11)** is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not  
9 more than 30 days or a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.

10       (14) ~~(16)~~—Subject to subsection ~~(17)~~, **(15)**, the secretary of  
11 state may cancel or revoke a communication impediment designation  
12 elected and maintained under this section if either of the  
13 following circumstances applies:

14       (a) The secretary of state determines that a communication  
15 impediment designation was fraudulently or erroneously elected.

16       (b) The secretary of state determines the communication  
17 impediment designation was abused during a traffic stop.

18       (15) ~~(17)~~—The secretary of state shall provide an individual  
19 notice and an opportunity to be heard before canceling or revoking  
20 a communication impediment designation under subsection ~~(16)~~. **(14)**.

21       ~~(18) As used in this section, "communication impediment" means~~  
22 ~~an individual has a health condition that may impede communication~~  
23 ~~with a police officer, including, but not limited to, any of the~~

27       Sec. 1a. As used in this act:

28       (a) **"Communication impediment" means a health condition of an**  
29 **individual that may impede the individual's communication with a**

1 police officer, including, but not limited to, any of the  
 2 following:

3 (i) Deafness or hearing loss.

4 (ii) An autism spectrum disorder.

5 (b) ~~(a)~~ "Highly restricted personal information" includes an  
 6 individual's photograph or image, Social Security number, digitized  
 7 signature, and medical and disability information and source  
 8 documents ~~presented~~ **provided** by an applicant to obtain a personal  
 9 identification card under section 1. Highly restricted personal  
 10 information also includes the confidential address of an individual  
 11 certified as a program participant in the address confidentiality  
 12 program under the address confidentiality program act, 2020 PA 301,  
 13 MCL 780.851 to 780.873. As used in this subdivision, "confidential  
 14 address" means that term as defined in section 3 of the address  
 15 confidentiality program act, 2020 PA 301, MCL 780.853.

16 (c) "LEIN" means the law enforcement information network  
 17 regulated under the C.J.I.S. policy council act, 1974 PA 163, MCL  
 18 28.211 to 28.215.

19 (d) ~~(b)~~ "Personal information" means information that  
 20 identifies an individual, including the individual's photograph or  
 21 image, name, address, ~~(but not including~~ the 5-digit zip code, ~~)~~  
 22 driver license number, Social Security number, telephone number,  
 23 digitized signature, and medical and disability information.

24 (e) ~~(c)~~ "Residence address" means the place that is the  
 25 settled home or domicile at which ~~a person legally~~ **an individual**  
 26 resides, which meets the definition of residence as defined in  
 27 section 11 of the Michigan election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.11.

28 (f) ~~(d)~~ "Resident" means ~~every person~~ **an individual** who  
 29 resides in **a settled or permanent home with the intention of**



~~1 remaining in this state. and establishes that he or she is legally~~  
~~2 present in the United States. This definition applies to the~~  
~~3 provisions of this act only.~~**The citizenship or immigration status**  
~~4 of an individual must not be considered in determining whether the~~  
~~5 individual is a resident of this state.~~

6 Sec. 2. (1) An official state personal identification card  
 7 must contain **all of** the following:

8 (a) An identification number permanently assigned to the  
 9 individual to whom the card is issued.

10 (b) Except as provided in section 2a, the full legal name,  
 11 date of birth, sex, residence address, height, weight, eye color,  
 12 digital photographic image, signature of or verification and  
 13 certification by the applicant, as determined by the secretary of  
 14 state, and expiration date of the official state personal  
 15 identification card. ~~If an official state personal identification~~  
~~16 card is issued to an individual described in section 1(5) who has~~  
~~17 temporary lawful status, the official state personal identification~~  
~~18 card must be issued in compliance with 6 CFR 37.21 or in compliance~~  
~~19 with the process established to comply with 6 CFR 37.71 by the~~  
~~20 secretary of state. As used in this subdivision, "temporary lawful~~  
~~21 status" means that term as defined in 6 CFR 37.3.~~

22 (c) An indication that the identification card contains 1 or  
 23 more of the following:

24 (i) The blood type of the individual.

25 (ii) Immunization data of the individual.

26 (iii) Medication data of the individual.

27 (iv) A statement that the individual is deaf.

28 (d) ~~In the case of~~**If** a holder of an official state personal  
 29 identification card ~~who has indicated his or her~~**the holder's** wish

1 to participate in the anatomical gift donor registry under part 101  
2 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123,  
3 a heart insignia on the front of the official state personal  
4 identification card.

5 (e) If requested by an individual who is a veteran as that  
6 term is defined in section 1 of 1965 PA 190, MCL 35.61, a  
7 designation that the individual is a veteran. The designation must  
8 be in a style and format considered appropriate by the secretary of  
9 state. The secretary of state shall require proof of discharge or  
10 separation of service from the armed forces of this state, another  
11 state, or the United States, and the nature of that discharge, for  
12 the purposes of verifying an individual's status as a veteran under  
13 this subdivision. The secretary of state shall consult with the  
14 department of military and veterans affairs in determining the  
15 proof that must be required to identify an individual's status as a  
16 veteran for the purposes of this subsection. The secretary of state  
17 may provide the department of military and veterans affairs and  
18 agencies of the counties of this state that provide veteran  
19 services with information provided by an applicant under this  
20 subsection for the purpose of veterans' benefits eligibility  
21 referral.

22 (f) Physical security features designed to prevent tampering,  
23 counterfeiting, or duplication of the official state personal  
24 identification card for fraudulent purposes.

25 (2) In conjunction with the application for an official state  
26 personal identification card, the secretary of state shall do all  
27 of the following:

28 (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:

29 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an

1 anatomical gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public  
2 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in  
3 accordance with this section.

4 (ii) Information describing the donor registry program  
5 maintained by ~~Michigan's~~ **this state's** federally designated organ  
6 procurement organization or its successor organization under  
7 section 10120 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL  
8 333.10120. The information required under this subparagraph must  
9 include the address and telephone number of ~~Michigan's~~ **this state's**  
10 federally designated organ procurement organization or its  
11 successor organization as described in section 10120 of the public  
12 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120.

13 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to have  
14 ~~his or her~~ **the applicant's** name placed on the registry described in  
15 subparagraph (ii).

16 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on  
17 ~~his or her~~ **the applicant's** official state personal identification  
18 card that ~~he or she~~ **the applicant** is willing to make an anatomical  
19 gift in the event of death under part 101 of the public health  
20 code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123, and in accordance  
21 with this section.

22 (c) Inform the applicant that, if ~~he or she~~ **the applicant**  
23 indicates to the secretary of state under this section a  
24 willingness to have ~~his or her~~ **the applicant's** name placed on the  
25 donor registry described in subdivision (a)(ii), the secretary of  
26 state will mark the applicant's record for the donor registry.

27 (3) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of  
28 subsection (2) by 1 or more of the following methods:

29 (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice

1 for the issuance or renewal of an official state personal  
2 identification card.

3 (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who personally  
4 appears at a secretary of state branch office.

5 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for  
6 applications processed by electronic means.

7 (4) The secretary of state shall prescribe the form of the  
8 official state personal identification card. The secretary of state  
9 shall designate a space on the official state personal  
10 identification card where the applicant may place a sticker or  
11 decal of a uniform size as the secretary may specify to indicate  
12 that the cardholder carries a separate emergency medical  
13 information card. The sticker or decal may be provided by any  
14 person, hospital, school, medical group, or association interested  
15 in assisting in implementing the emergency medical information  
16 card, but must meet the specifications of the secretary of state.  
17 The sticker or decal also may be used to indicate that the  
18 cardholder has designated 1 or more patient advocates in accordance  
19 with section 5506 of the estates and protected individuals code,  
20 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5506. The emergency medical information card,  
21 carried separately by the cardholder, may contain the information  
22 described in subsection (2)(c), information concerning the  
23 cardholder's patient advocate designation, other emergency medical  
24 information, or an indication as to where the cardholder has stored  
25 or registered emergency medical information. An original official  
26 state personal identification card or the renewal of an existing  
27 official state personal identification card issued to an individual  
28 ~~less~~**younger** than 21 years of age must be portrait or vertical in  
29 form, and an official state personal identification card issued to

1 an individual 21 years of age or ~~over~~**older** must be landscape or  
2 horizontal in form. Except as otherwise required in this act, other  
3 information required on the official state personal identification  
4 card under this act may appear on the official state personal  
5 identification card in a form prescribed by the secretary of state.

6 (5) The official state personal identification card must not  
7 contain a fingerprint or finger image of the applicant.

8 (6) Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of  
9 state shall retain and use an individual's digital photographic  
10 image and signature described in subsection (1)(b) only for  
11 programs administered by the secretary of state as specifically  
12 authorized by law. An individual's digital photographic image or  
13 signature must ~~only~~**not** be used **except** as follows:

14 (a) By a federal, state, or local governmental agency for a  
15 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.

16 (b) By the secretary of state for a use specifically  
17 authorized by law.

18 (c) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department  
19 of state police the images of individuals required to be registered  
20 under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.721  
21 to 28.730, upon the department of state police providing the  
22 secretary of state an updated list of those individuals.

23 (d) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department  
24 of state police a digitized photograph taken of the applicant for  
25 an official state personal identification card for use as provided  
26 in section 5c of 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.425c.

27 (e) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the department  
28 of licensing and regulatory affairs the images of applicants for an  
29 official state registry identification card issued under section 6

1 of the Michigan Medical Marihuana Act, 2008 IL 1, MCL 333.26426, if  
2 the department of licensing and regulatory affairs promulgates  
3 rules requiring a photograph as a design element for an official  
4 state registry identification card.

5 (f) As necessary to comply with a law of this state or the  
6 United States.

7 (7) If an individual presents evidence of statutory blindness  
8 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368, and is issued  
9 or is the holder of an official state personal identification card,  
10 the secretary of state shall mark the individual's official state  
11 personal identification card in a manner that clearly indicates  
12 that the cardholder is ~~legally~~ **statutorily** blind.

13 (8) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an  
14 individual who indicates a willingness to have ~~his or her the~~  
15 **individual's** name placed on the donor registry described in  
16 subsection (2) (a) (ii). Information about an individual's indication  
17 of a willingness to have ~~his or her the~~ **individual's** name placed on  
18 the donor registry that is obtained by the secretary of state and  
19 forwarded under this section is exempt from disclosure under  
20 section 13(1) (d) of the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,  
21 MCL 15.243. As required in section 10120 of the public health code,  
22 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the secretary of state shall establish  
23 and maintain the donor registry in a manner that complies with that  
24 section and that provides electronic access, including, but not  
25 limited to, the transfer of data to this state's federally  
26 designated organ procurement organization or its successor  
27 organization, tissue banks, and eye banks.

28 (9) An official state personal identification card may contain  
29 an identifier for voter registration purposes.

1           (10) An official state personal identification card must  
2 contain information appearing in electronic or machine-readable  
3 codes needed to conduct a transaction with the secretary of state.  
4 The information must be limited to the information described in  
5 subsection (1)(a) and (b) except for the individual's digital  
6 photographic image and signature or verification and certification,  
7 state of issuance, and other information necessary for use with  
8 electronic devices, machine readers, or automatic teller machines  
9 and must not contain the individual's driving record or other  
10 personal identifier. The official state personal identification  
11 card must identify the encoded information.

12           (11) An official state personal identification card must be  
13 issued only upon authorization of the secretary of state, and must  
14 be manufactured in a manner to prohibit as nearly as possible the  
15 ability to reproduce, alter, counterfeit, forge, or duplicate the  
16 official state personal identification card without ready  
17 detection.

18           (12) Except as otherwise provided in this act, an applicant  
19 shall pay a fee of \$10.00 to the secretary of state for each  
20 original or renewal official state personal identification card  
21 issued. ~~The secretary of state shall not assess a late renewal fee~~  
22 ~~for an official state personal identification card that expires on~~  
23 ~~or after March 1, 2020 and is renewed before March 31, 2021. The~~  
24 ~~secretary of state shall not assess a late renewal fee for an~~  
25 ~~official state personal identification card that expires after~~  
26 ~~March 31, 2021 but before August 1, 2021 and is renewed within 120~~  
27 ~~days after the date of the expiration. The secretary of state~~  
28 ~~shall, upon an applicant's request, reimburse a late renewal fee~~  
29 ~~assessed and collected for an official state personal~~

~~identification card that expires after March 31, 2021 but before August 1, 2021 and is renewed within 120 days after the date of the expiration of the official state personal identification card. The~~  
department of treasury shall deposit the fees received and collected under this section in the state treasury to the credit of the general fund. The legislature shall appropriate the fees credited to the general fund under this act to the secretary of state for the administration of this act. Appropriations from the Michigan transportation fund created under section 10 of 1951 PA 51, MCL 247.660, must not be used to compensate the secretary of state for costs incurred and services performed under this section.

(13) An original or renewal official state personal identification card expires on the birthday of the individual to whom it is issued in the fourth year following the date of issuance. ~~or on the date the individual is no longer considered to be legally present in the United States under section 1, whichever is earlier.~~ The secretary of state shall not issue an official state personal identification card under this act for a period ~~greater~~ **that is longer** than 4 years. Except as provided in this subsection, the secretary of state may issue a renewal official state personal identification card ~~for 1 additional 4-year period or beginning on July 1, 2021,~~ for 2 additional 4-year periods, by mail or by other methods prescribed by the secretary of state. The secretary of state shall require renewal in person by an individual required under section 5a of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a, to maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's license or official state personal identification card.

(14) The secretary of state shall waive the fee under this section if the applicant is any of the following:



1 (a) An individual 65 years of age or older.

2 (b) An individual who has had ~~his or her~~ **the individual's**  
 3 operator's or chauffeur's license suspended, revoked, or denied  
 4 under the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.1 to 257.923,  
 5 because of a mental or physical infirmity or disability.

6 (c) An individual who presents evidence of statutory blindness  
 7 as provided in 1978 PA 260, MCL 393.351 to 393.368.

8 (d) An individual who presents evidence of 1 or more of the  
 9 following:

10 (i) A notice of case action from the department of health and  
 11 human services indicating that the individual is a participant in 1  
 12 or both of the following programs and is making ~~his or her~~ **the**  
 13 **individual's** application for an official state personal  
 14 identification card during a period in which ~~he or she~~ **the**  
 15 **individual** is receiving benefits:

16 (A) The family independence program.

17 (B) The state disability assistance program.

18 (ii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit  
 19 award letter ~~indicating~~ **or verification letter that indicates that**  
 20 the applicant is currently receiving payments under ~~the federal~~  
 21 supplemental security income ~~program~~ as that term is defined in  
 22 section 57 of the social welfare act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.57, or  
 23 the Social Security disability income program.

24 ~~(iii) A United States Social Security Administration benefit~~  
 25 ~~verification letter indicating the applicant is currently receiving~~  
 26 ~~payments under the federal supplemental security income program as~~

(b) **Allows** law enforcement agencies of this state to access emergency contact information and ~~, beginning July 1, 2021, to view~~ a communication impediment designation that the holder of an official state personal identification card has voluntarily provided to the secretary of state.

(20) If an applicant provides proof to the secretary of state that ~~he or she~~ **the applicant** is a minor who has been emancipated under 1968 PA 293, MCL 722.1 to 722.6, the official state personal
