HOUSE BILL NO. 4226

March 12, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Linting, Greene, Rigas, Woolford, Kunse, Schmaltz, Schuette, Thompson, Breen and Meerman and referred to Committee on Education and Workforce.

A bill to amend 1941 PA 207, entitled "Fire prevention code,"

by amending section 19 (MCL 29.19), as amended by 2024 PA 36.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 19. (1) The chief administrative officer and the teachers
- 2 of all schools, including state supported schools, and the owner,
- 3 or owner's representative, of all school dormitories shall have a
- 4 fire drill each month and ensure unrestricted emergency egress
- 5 during school hours and when the school is open to the public. Each
- 6 teacher in a school, including a state supported school, and the
- 7 owner or owner's representative of a school dormitory shall comply

- 1 with these requirements and keep a record of the drills.
- 2 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3), a minimum of 8-7
- 3 fire drills is required for each school year. If weather conditions
- 4 do not permit allow fire drills to be held at least once 1 time a
- 5 month, then at least 5-4 fire drills must be held in the fall of
- 6 each school year and 3 fire drills must be held during the
- 7 remaining part of the school year.
- 8 (3) A minimum of 5-4 fire drills is required for each school
- 9 year for a school that operates any of grades K to 12. Three Two of
- 10 the fire drills must be held by December 1 of the school year, and
- 11 2 must be held during the remaining part of the school year, with a
- 12 reasonable spacing interval between each drill.
- 13 (4) A minimum of 2 tornado safety drills is required for each
- 14 school year at the schools and facilities described in subsection
- 15 (1). At least 1 of the tornado safety drills must be conducted
- 16 during March of the school year. These drills must be conducted for
- 17 the purpose of preventing injuries caused by severe weather.
- 18 (5) A minimum of $\frac{3}{4}$ drills in which the occupants are
- 19 restricted to the interior of the building and the building secured
- 20 is required for each school year at a school that operates any of
- 21 grades K to 12. At least 1 of these the 4 drills must be conducted
- 22 by December 1 of the school year, and at least 1 must be conducted
- 23 after January 1 of the school year, with a reasonable spacing
- 24 interval between each drill. At least 1 of the 4 drills must be
- 25 conducted in accordance with subsection (6), and at least 1 must be
- 26 conducted when students are in between classes. A drill conducted
- 27 under this subsection must include security measures that are
- 28 appropriate to an emergency such as the release of a hazardous
- 29 material or the presence of a potentially dangerous individual on

- 1 or near the premises. The governing body of a school shall seek
- 2 input from the administration of the school and local public safety
- 3 officials on the nature of the drills to be conducted under this
- 4 subsection.
- **5** (6) A school that operates any of grades K to 12 shall conduct
- 6 at least 1 of the drills required by this section during a lunch or
- 7 recess period, or at another time when a significant number of the
- 8 students are gathered but not in the classroom.
- **9** (7) For a school that operates any of grades K to 12, the
- 10 governing body of the school shall ensure that documentation of a
- 11 completed school safety drill is posted on its website not later
- 12 than 30 school days after the drill is completed and is maintained
- 13 on the website for at least 3 years. For a school operated by a
- 14 school district or intermediate school district, the documentation
- 15 may be posted on the district website. The documentation posted on
- 16 the website must include at least all of the following:
- 17 (a) The name of the school.
- (b) The school year of the drill.
- 19 (c) The date and time of the drill.
- 20 (d) The type of drill completed.
- 21 (e) The number of completed drills for that school year for
- 22 each type of drill required under subsections (3) to (5).
- 23 (f) The signature of the school principal or the school
- 24 principal's designee acknowledging the completion of the drill.
- 25 (g) The name of the individual in charge of conducting the
- 26 drill, if other than the school principal.
- 27 (8) Not By not later than September 15 of each school year,
- 28 the chief administrator of a school that operates any of grades K
- 29 to 12, or the chief administrator's designee, shall provide a list

- 1 of the scheduled drill days for the school buildings operated by
- 2 the school, school district, intermediate school district, or
- 3 public school academy to the county emergency management
- 4 coordinator appointed under section 9 of the emergency management
- 5 act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.409. A scheduled drill that is not
- 6 conducted on a scheduled drill day due to conditions not within the
- 7 control of school authorities, such as severe storms, fires,
- 8 epidemics, utility power unavailability, water or sewer failure, or
- 9 health conditions as defined by the city, county, or state health
- 10 authorities, will not result in a violation of this section if the
- 11 school conducts the minimum number of drills required under
- 12 subsections (3) to (5), the school reschedules the drill to occur
- 13 not later than 10 school days after the scheduled date of the
- 14 canceled drill, and the chief administrator notifies the county
- 15 emergency management coordinator of the rescheduled date for the
- 16 drill. The county emergency management coordinator shall provide
- 17 this information to the appropriate local emergency management
- 18 coordinator appointed under section 9 of the emergency management
- 19 act, 1976 PA 390, MCL 30.409, if any, and, consistent with
- 20 applicable federal, state, and local emergency operations plans, to
- 21 the department of state police district coordinator and the county
- 22 sheriff for the county or the chief of police or fire chief for the
- 23 municipality where the school is located, or the designee of the
- 24 sheriff, chief of police, or fire chief. The information provided
- 25 under this subsection is exempt from disclosure under the freedom
- 26 of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 27 (9) A public school that operates any of grades K to 12 shall
- 28 not conduct a drill required under this section at a time that
- 29 would interfere with the conduct of a state-mandated assessment.

- 1 (10) The state fire marshal, a fire chief, or a firefighter in2 uniform acting under orders and directions of the fire chief may
- 3 cause fire drills to be held in school houses, school dormitories,
- 4 and other public buildings as the state fire marshal considers
- 5 advisable. The state fire marshal may order the installation of
- 6 other protective apparatus or equipment that conforms to recognized
- 7 and approved modern practices.
- 8 (11) The department of state police emergency management and
- 9 homeland security division shall develop a model to be used by a
- 10 school in conducting a drill under subsection (5).
- 11 (12) Until the beginning of the 2025-2026 school year, the
- 12 governing body of a school that operates any of grades kindergarten
- 13 K to 12 shall adopt and implement a cardiac emergency response plan
- 14 for the school. The cardiac emergency response plan shall must
- 15 address and provide for at least all of the following:
- 16 (a) Use and regular maintenance of automated external
- 17 defibrillators, if available.
- 18 (b) Activation of a cardiac emergency response team during an
- 19 identified cardiac emergency.
- 20 (c) A plan for effective and efficient communication
- 21 throughout the school campus.
- 22 (d) If the school includes grades 9 to 12, a training plan for
- 23 the use of an automated external defibrillator and in
- 24 cardiopulmonary resuscitation techniques.
- 25 (e) Incorporation and integration of the local emergency
- 26 response system and emergency response agencies with the school's
- **27** plan.
- 28 (f) An annual review and evaluation of the cardiac emergency
- 29 response plan.

- 1 (13) As used in this section:
- (a) "School" does not include a postsecondary educationalinstitution as that term is defined in section 19a.
- 4 (b) "School dormitory" does not include a postsecondary
 5 educational institution dormitory as that term is defined in
 6 section 19a.
