HOUSE BILL NO. 4273

March 19, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Wilson, Paquette, Mentzer, Dievendorf, Morgan, Byrnes, Rheingans, Wegela, Koleszar, Price, Brixie, Conlin, Coffia, Paiz, Miller, Tsernoglou, Andrews, Arbit, Longjohn, MacDonell, Myers-Phillips and McKinney and referred to Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 472, entitled

"An act to regulate political activity; to regulate lobbyists, lobbyist agents, and lobbying activities; to require registration of lobbyists and lobbyist agents; to require the filing of reports; to prescribe the powers and duties of the department of state; to prescribe penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 5 (MCL 4.415), as amended by 1986 PA 83.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5. (1) "Governmental body" means a state legislative or
- 2 governing body, including a board, commission, committee,
- 3 subcommittee, authority, or council, that may, under a state

- 1 constitution, statute, or rule, exercise governmental or
- 2 proprietary authority or perform a governmental or proprietary
- 3 function, or a lessee of the body that performs an essential public
- 4 purpose and function under the lease agreement.
- 5 (2) "Influencing" means promoting, supporting, affecting,
- 6 modifying, opposing, or delaying by any means, including the
- 7 providing of or use of information, statistics, studies, or
- 8 analysis.
- 9 (3) "Legislative action" means introduction, sponsorship,
- 10 support, opposition, consideration, debate, vote, passage, defeat,
- 11 approval, veto, delay, or an official action by an official in the
- 12 executive branch or an official in the legislative branch on a
- 13 bill, resolution, amendment, nomination, appointment, report, or
- 14 any matter pending or proposed in a legislative committee or either
- 15 house of the legislature. Legislative action does not include the
- 16 representation of a person who that has been subpoenaed to appear
- 17 before the legislature or an agency of the legislature.
- 18 (4) (2) "Lobbying" means communicating directly with an
- 19 official in the executive branch of state government or an official
- 20 in the legislative branch of state government for the purpose of
- 21 influencing legislative or administrative action. Lobbying does not
- 22 include the providing of technical information by a person other
- 23 than a person as defined in subsection (5) lobbyist agent or an
- 24 employee of a person as defined in subsection (5) lobbyist agent
- 25 when appearing before an officially convened legislative committee
- 26 or executive department hearing panel. As used in this subsection,
- 27 "technical information" means empirically verifiable data provided
- 28 by a person recognized as an expert in the subject area to which
- 29 the information provided is related.

- 5 (5) (4) "Lobbyist" means any of the following:
- 6 (a) A person whose expenditures for lobbying are more than7 \$1,000.00 in value in any 12-month period.
- 8 (b) A person whose expenditures for lobbying are more than
 9 \$250.00 in value in any 12-month period, if the amount is expended
 10 on lobbying a single public official.
- 11 (c) For the purpose of subdivisions (a) and (b), groups of 25
 12 or more people shall not have their personal expenditures for food,
 13 travel, and beverage included, providing if those expenditures are
 14 not reimbursed by a lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
- (d) The state or a political subdivision which that contractsfor a lobbyist agent.
- 17 (6) (5)—"Lobbyist agent" means a person who that receives
 18 compensation or reimbursement of actual expenses, or both, in a
 19 combined amount in excess of \$250.00 in any 12-month period for
 20 lobbying.
- 21 (6) "Representative of the lobbyist" means any of the
 22 following:
- 23 (a) An employee of the lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
- 24 (b) For purposes of section 8(1)(b)(i) and 9(1)(b), a member
 25 of the lobbyist or employee of a member of the lobbyist, when the
 26 lobbyist is a membership organization or association, and when the
 27 lobbyist agent or an employee of the lobbyist or lobbyist agent is
 28 present during any part of the period during which the purchased
- 29 food or beverage is consumed.

- 4 (7) Lobbyist or lobbyist agent does not include any of the following:
- 6 (a) A publisher, owner, or working member of the press, radio,
 7 or television while disseminating news or editorial comment to the
 8 general public in the ordinary course of business.
- 9 (b) All elected or appointed public officials of state or
 10 local government who are acting in the course or scope of the
 11 office for no compensation, other than that provided by law for the
 12 office, -not including any of the following:
- 13 (c) For the purposes of this act, subdivision (b) shall not

 14 include:
- (i) Employees of public or private colleges, communitycolleges, junior colleges, or universities.
- 17 (ii) Employees of townships, villages, cities, counties, or school boards.
- 19 (iii) Employees of state executive departments.
- 20 (iv) Employees of the judicial branch of government.
- (8) "Mass mailing" means not less than 1,000 pieces ofsubstantially similar material mailed within a 7-day period.
- (9) "Official in the executive branch" means the governor,
 lieutenant governor, secretary of state, attorney general, ; or an
 individual who is in the executive branch of state government and

- 1 not under civil service, ; a classified director, chief deputy
- 2 director, or deputy director of a state department. This Official
- 3 in the executive branch includes an individual who is elected or
- 4 appointed and has not yet taken, or an individual who is nominated
- 5 for appointment to, any of the offices or agencies enumerated in
- 6 this subsection. An official Official in the executive branch does
- 7 not include a person an individual serving in a clerical,
- 8 nonpolicy-making, non-policy-making, or nonadministrative capacity.
- 9 In addition to all of the foregoing, an official Official in the
- 10 executive branch includes, but is not limited to, all of the
- 11 following:
- 12 (a) In the executive office of the governor, the chief and
- 13 deputy chief of staff, press secretary, director of job training,
- 14 and director of personnel.
- 15 (b) In the department of agriculture and rural development,
- 16 the racing commissioner and a member of the commission on
- 17 agriculture commission.and rural development.
- 18 (c) In the department of civil rights, a A member of the civil
- 19 rights commission.
- 20 (d) In the department of civil service, a member of the civil
- 21 service commission.
- (e) In the department of commerce, the commissioner of
- 23 financial institutions, labor and economic opportunity, the
- 24 executive director of the state housing development authority, the
- 25 director of the unemployment insurance agency, the director of the
- 26 Michigan occupational safety and health administration, the
- 27 director of the workers' disability compensation agency, and a
- 28 member of the liquor control commission, strategic fund board,
- 29 Michigan unemployment insurance appeals commission, unemployment

- insurance agency, state housing development authority, travel
 commission, or public service commission.wage deviation board.
- (f) In the department of education, a member of the state
 board of education , higher education facilities commission, higher
 education facilities authority, higher education assistance
 authority, higher education student loan authority, or state tenure
 commission.
 - (g) In the department of labor, the director of the bureau of workers' disability compensation, the director of the employment security commission, licensing and regulatory affairs, the utility consumer participation board and a member of the construction code commission, employment relations commission, employment security board of review, employment security commission, or wage deviation board.public service commission, or liquor control commission.
 - (h) In The director of the department of licensing and regulation, the state insurance commissioner.and financial services.
 - (i) In the department of **technology**, management and budget, the lottery commissioner, the director of the office of services to the aging, the director of the office of state employer, the chairperson of the crime victims compensation board, and or a member of the council for the arts, state administrative board. The state building authority, toxic substance control commission, or utility consumer participation board.
 - (j) In the department of natural resources, the supervisor of wells and a member of the air pollution control commission, natural resources commission, or water resources commission.environment, Great Lakes, and energy, the director of the department.
- (k) In the department of public health, a member of the

occupational health standards commission.

- 2 (k) (l)—In the department of transportation, a member of the
 3 aeronautics commission and a state transportation commissioner.
- 4 (1) (m)—In the department of treasury, a member of the hospital finance authority, investment advisory committee, or state tax commission, state building authority, higher education facilities commission, higher education facilities authority, higher education assistance authority, or higher education student loan authority.
 - (m) In the department of health and human services, the director of the department of health and human services and the chairperson of the crime victims services commission.
 - (n) In the department of natural resources, the director of the department of natural resources, a member of the natural resources commission, and the toxic substance control commission.
 - (o) A member of the Michigan arts and culture council.
- 16 (p) The director of the Michigan department of lifelong 17 education, advancement, and potential.
- (q) A member of the Michigan independent citizensredistricting commission.
- 20 (r) The lottery commissioner.
- (10) "Official in the legislative branch" means a member of the legislature, the auditor general, the deputy auditor general, an employee of the consumer's consumers council, the director of the legislative retirement system, a legislative staff, or any other employee of the legislature other than an individual employed by the this state in a clerical or nonpolicy-making non-policy-making capacity.
- 28 (11) "Governmental body" means any state legislative or
 29 governing body, including a board, commission, committee,

- 1 subcommittee, authority, or council, which is empowered by state
- 2 constitution, statute, or rule to exercise governmental or
- 3 proprietary authority or perform a governmental or proprietary
- 4 function, or a lessee thereof performing an essential public
- 5 purpose and function under the lease agreement.
 - (11) "Representative of the lobbyist" means any of the following:
 - (a) An employee of the lobbyist or lobbyist agent.
- 9 (b) For purposes of sections 8(1)(b)(i) and 9(1)(b), a member of the lobbyist or employee of a member of the lobbyist, when the lobbyist is a membership organization or association, and when the lobbyist agent or an employee of the lobbyist or lobbyist agent is present during any part of the period during which the purchased food or beverage is consumed.
- 15 (c) A person that is reimbursed by the lobbyist or lobbyist 16 agent for an expenditure, other than an expenditure for food or 17 beverage, which was incurred for the purpose of lobbying.
