April 16, 2025, Introduced by Reps. Fairbairn, Prestin, Bohnak, Borton, Markkanen, Kelly, Cavitt, Roth and Beson and referred to Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make, supplement, adjust, and consolidate appropriations for various state departments and agencies, the judicial branch, and the legislative branch for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025; to provide for certain conditions on appropriations; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

10 PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

11 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025

12 **GENERAL SECTIONS**

13 Sec. 201. In accordance with section 30 of article IX of the

14 state constitution of 1963, for the fiscal year ending September

15 30, 2025, total state spending from state sources under part 1 is

16 \$75,000,000.00 and state spending from state sources to be paid to

17 local units of government is \$75,000,000.00.

18 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized

19 under this part and part 1 are subject to the management and budget

20 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

21 Sec. 203. If the state administrative board, acting under

22 section 3 of 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.3, transfers funds from an amount

23 appropriated under this article, the legislature may, by a

24 concurrent resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected

25 to and serving in each house, inter-transfer funds for the

26 particular department, board, commission, officer, or institution.

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28 **DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE**

29 Sec. 301. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for storm disaster

1 relief grants must be allocated by the department to local units of
2 government in areas of this state that have realized a significant
3 financial hardship caused by storm damage.

4 (2) Funds appropriated in part 1 must be used by local units
5 to assist individual residents, businesses, and communities with
6 identifying and securing disaster assistance. Funding may be used
7 for various purposes, including, but not limited to, all of the
8 following:

9 (a) State match funding required for receipt and expenditure
10 of any federal funding made available for emergency management
11 assistance.

12 (b) Emergency actions needed to protect life, property, public
13 health, and public safety, including shelter and emergency
14 supplies.

15 (c) Labor assistance, including unemployment benefits,
16 temporary employment opportunities for disaster recovery and
17 assistance with cleanup and recovery, and support for dislocated
18 workers.

19 (d) Energy assistance, including paying heating and
20 electricity bills, preventing shutoffs, and providing crisis
21 assistance.

22 (e) Repair or replacement of disaster-damaged public
23 infrastructure, facilities, and private nonprofit organizations.

24 (3) Any funds remaining after awards have been granted for the
25 purposes specified in subsection (2) shall be allocated for the
26 following purposes, on a first-come, first-served basis:

27 (a) To address damage on land owned by the state and the
28 department of natural resources.

29 (b) To reimburse other third-party providers that assisted in

1 natural disaster recovery efforts. Purposes for reimbursement
2 payments shall include, but not be limited to, infrastructure
3 repairs, network infrastructure costs, and costs for deployment of
4 emergency first responders.

5 (4) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for storm
6 disaster relief grants are designated as a work project
7 appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds do not lapse at the
8 end of the fiscal year and are available for expenditures under
9 this section until the project has been completed. The following is
10 in compliance with section 451a of the management and budget act,
11 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

12 (a) The purpose of the project is to assist individual
13 residents, businesses, and communities of this state with
14 identifying and securing disaster assistance.

15 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
16 employees, contracts with vendors, or both.

17 (c) The total estimated cost of the project is \$75,000,000.00.

18 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2027.
