A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled "The Michigan penal code,"

by amending sections 81, 81a, and 81d (MCL 750.81, 750.81a, and 750.81d), sections 81 and 81a as amended by 2023 PA 271 and section 81d as amended by 2006 PA 517.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 81. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a 2 person who assaults or assaults and batters an individual, if no
- 3 other punishment is prescribed by law, is guilty of a misdemeanor

- 1 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of
- 2 not more than \$500.00, or both. If the victim of a violation under
- 3 this subsection is a health professional or medical volunteer and
- 4 the violation occurs while the victim is performing the victim's
- 5 duties as a health professional or medical volunteer, the person is
- 6 quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more
- 7 than 93 days or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both. The
- 8 enhanced fine under this subsection does not apply if the defendant
- 9 is a patient who is receiving treatment from the victim.
- 10 (2) Except as provided in subsection (3), (4), or (5), an
- 11 individual who assaults or assaults and batters the individual's
- 12 spouse or former spouse, an individual with whom the individual has
- 13 or has had a dating relationship, an individual with whom the
- 14 individual has had a child in common, or a resident or former
- 15 resident of the individual's household, is quilty of a misdemeanor
- 16 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of
- 17 not more than \$500.00, or both.

- 20 is quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more

 11 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 5 years or a fine of
 12 not more than \$5,000.00, or both:
- (a) This section or an ordinance of a political subdivision ofthis state substantially corresponding to this section.
 - (b) Section 81a, 82, 83, 84, or 86.
- (c) A law of another state or an ordinance of a political
 subdivision of another state substantially corresponding to this
 section or section 81a, 82, 83, 84, or 86.

 - (7) The operator of a health facility or agency or a hospital or psychiatric hospital shall post a sign in the health facility or agency or hospital or psychiatric hospital in a prominent and visible location that provides that a person, other than a patient receiving treatment, who assaults a health professional or medical volunteer in violation of this section is subject to the enhanced fine provided for in this section and that a patient receiving treatment who assaults a health professional or medical volunteer

whether operated by a governmental unit or a private entity, and

- whose duties as a volunteer involve the provision of direct patient
 care, or who is providing indirect patient care under the direction
 of a hospital or psychiatric hospital, health facility or agency,
 health system, or health care provider.
- 5 Sec. 81a. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a 6 person an individual who assaults an individual without a weapon 7 and inflicts serious or aggravated injury upon on that individual 8 without intending to commit murder or to inflict great bodily harm 9 less than murder is quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by 10 imprisonment for not more than 1 year or a fine of not more than 11 \$1,000.00, or both. If the victim of a violation under this 12 subsection is a health professional or medical volunteer and the 13 violation occurs while the victim is performing the victim's duties 14 as a health professional or medical volunteer, the person is quilty 15 of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 1 16 year or a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both. The enhanced 17 fine under this subsection does not apply if the defendant is a 18 patient who is receiving treatment from the victim.
 - (2) Except as provided in subsection (3), an individual who assaults the individual's spouse or former spouse, an individual with whom the individual has or has had a dating relationship, an individual with whom the individual has had a child in common, or a resident or former resident of the same household without a weapon and inflicts serious or aggravated injury upon on that individual without intending to commit murder or to inflict great bodily harm less than murder is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 1 year or a fine of not more than \$1,000.00, or both.
