SENATE BILL NO. 28

February 04, 2025, Introduced by Senators THEIS, BELLINO, HOITENGA, LINDSEY, RUNESTAD, OUTMAN and MCBROOM and referred to Committee on Regulatory Affairs.

A bill to amend 1988 PA 466, entitled "Animal industry act,"

by amending section 46 (MCL 287.746), as amended by 2019 PA 132.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 46. (1) As used in this section:
- 2 (a) "Business owner" means a person that owns or controls the
- 3 operations of a business.
- 4 (b) "Cage-free housing system" means an indoor or outdoor
- 5 controlled environment for egg-laying hens to which all of the
- 6 following apply:

(i) For an indoor environment, the hens are free to roam 1 2 unrestricted except by any of the following: 3 (A) Exterior walls. 4 (B) In multitiered aviaries, partially slatted systems, 5 single-level all-litter floor systems, or any other housing system that complies with the requirements of this section, interior 6 fencing used to contain the entire flock within the building or 7 8 subdivide flocks into smaller groups, if farm employees can walk 9 through each contained or subdivided area to provide care to hens 10 and if each hen has the minimum amount of usable floor space 11 described in subsection (2) (b) (ii). (ii) The hens are provided enrichments that allow the hens to 12 exhibit natural behaviors. To qualify as a cage free housing system 13 under this definition, the enrichments used in the housing system 14 must include, but are not limited to, scratch areas, perches, nest 15 16 boxes, and dust bathing areas. 17 (iii) For an indoor environment, a farm employee is able to 18 provide care to the hens while standing within the hens' usable 19 floor space. 20 (iv) The environment does not include any cage systems commonly 21 described as battery cages, colony cages, enriched cages, or 22 enriched colony cages, or any cage system similar to those systems. (a) (c) "Calf raised for yeal" means a calf of the boyine 23 24 species kept for the purpose of producing the food product 25 described as veal. 26 (b) (d) "Covered animal" means a gestating sow -or calf 27 raised for veal , or egg-laying hen that is kept on a farm. 28 (e) "Egg-laying hen" means a female domesticated chicken,

turkey, duck, goose, or guinea fowl kept for the purpose of egg

- (c) (f) "Enclosure" means a cage, crate, or other structure
 used to confine a covered animal.
- 4 (d) (g) "Farm" means the land, building, support facilities,
 5 and other equipment that are wholly or partially used for the
 6 commercial production of animals or animal products used for food
 7 or fiber. Farm does not include a live animal market.
- 8 (e) (h)—"Farm owner or operator" means a person that owns or9 controls the operation of a farm.
- 10 (f) (i) "Fully extending its limbs" means fully extending all
 11 limbs without touching the side of an enclosure.
- 12 (g) (j) "Gestating sow" means a sow of the porcine species
 13 kept for the primary purpose of breeding and confirmed to be
 14 pregnant.
- (k) "Multitiered aviary" means a housing system in which hens

 have unfettered access to multiple elevated platforms that provide

 the hens with usable floor space both on top of and underneath the

 platforms.
 - (1) "Partially slatted system" means a housing system in which hens have unfettered access to elevated flat platforms under which manure drops through the flooring to a pit or litter removal belt.
- (h) (m) "Person" means an individual, firm, partnership, joint
 venture, association, limited liability company, corporation,
 estate, trust, receiver, or syndicate.
- 25 (n) "Shell egg" means a whole egg of an egg-laying hen in its
 26 shell form that is intended for use as human food.
- 27 (o) "Single-level all-litter floor system" means a housing
 28 system bedded with litter in which hens have limited or no access
 29 to elevated flat platforms.

- (i) (p)—"Turning around freely" means turning in a complete
 circle without any impediment, including a tether, and without
 touching the side of an enclosure or another animal.
- (q) "Usable floor space" means the total square footage of
 floor space provided to each egg-laying hen, as calculated by
 dividing the total square footage of floor space provided to hens
 in an enclosure by the number of hens in that enclosure. Usable
 floor space includes ground space or elevated level flat platforms
 upon which hens are able to roost, but does not include perches or
 ramps.
- 11 (2) Subject to subsections (3) and (9), notwithstanding any
 12 other provision of law, a farm owner or operator shall not do
 13 either of the following:
- (a) (i) Lying down, standing up, or fully extending its limbs.
- (b) $\frac{(ii)}{(ii)}$ Turning around freely.
- 21 (i) In an enclosure other than a cage-free housing system.
- 22 (ii) With less than the amount of usable floor space per hen as
 23 provided in the housing guidelines for cage-free production
 24 contained in "Animal Husbandry Guidelines for U.S. Egg-Laying
 25 Flocks", 2017 edition, published by United Egg Producers.
- 26 (3) Subsection (2) does not apply to a covered animal during27 any of the following:
- 28 (a) Scientific or agricultural research.
- 29 (b) Examination, testing, individual treatment, or operation

- 1 for veterinary purposes, by an individual licensed to practice
- 2 veterinary medicine under part 188 of the public health code, 1978
- **3** PA 368, MCL 333.18801 to 333.18838.
- 4 (c) Transportation, unless otherwise in violation of section
- 5 51 of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.51, relating to
- 6 confining animals on railroad cars.
- 7 (d) Rodeo exhibitions, state or county fair exhibitions, 4-H
- 8 programs, and similar exhibitions.
- ${f 9}$ (e) The slaughter of a covered animal as provided by 1962 PA
- 10 163, MCL 287.551 to 287.556, and other applicable law and rules.
- 11 (f) In the case of a gestating sow, the period beginning 7
- 12 days before the gestating sow's expected date of giving birth.
- (4) Notwithstanding any other provision of law and subject to
- 14 subsections (5) and (9), for the purposes described in section 1, a
- 15 business owner shall not knowingly engage in the sale of any shell
- 16 egg in this state that the business owner knows or should know is
- 17 the product of an egg-laying hen that was confined in a manner that
- 18 is inconsistent with the requirements of this section.
- (5) Subsection (4) does not apply to the sale of shell eggs
- 20 that are the product of a farm with less than 3,000 egg-laying
- 21 hens.
- 22 (4) (6) The department or the attorney general may bring a
- 23 civil action to restrain, by temporary or permanent injunction, any
- 24 act or practice in violation of this section. The action may be
- 25 brought in the circuit court for the county where the defendant
- 26 resides or conducts business. The court may issue a temporary or
- 27 permanent injunction and issue other equitable orders or judgments.
- 28 A defense described and made available relating to customary animal
- 29 husbandry or farming practices involving livestock, under sections

- 1 50(12)(f) and 50b(14) of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL
- 2 750.50 and 750.50b, or similar provisions, is not a defense to an
- 3 action brought for the violation of this section involving a
- 4 covered animal. In addition, the criminal penalties provided in
- 5 section 44 are not applicable to a violation of this section.
- 6 (7) It is a defense to an action to enforce subsection (4)
- 7 that a business owner relied in good faith upon a written
- 8 certification or guarantee by the supplier of a shell egg that the
- 9 shell egg is not the product of an egg-laying hen that was confined
- 10 in a manner that is inconsistent with the requirements of this
- 11 section.
- 12 (5) (8) This section is in addition to, and not in lieu
- 13 instead of, any other laws protecting animal welfare. This section
- 14 does not limit any other state law protecting the welfare of
- 15 animals.
- 16 (6) (9) This section does not apply to egg-laying hens or
- 17 shell eggs until December 31, 2024 and does not apply to gestating
- 18 sows until April 1, 2020.
