SENATE BILL NO. 31

February 04, 2025, Introduced by Senators CAVANAGH and GEISS and referred to Committee on Housing and Human Services.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending sections 20201 and 21513 (MCL 333.20201 and 333.21513), section 20201 as amended by 2016 PA 499 and section 21513 as amended by 2022 PA 265, and by adding section 21537.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 20201. (1) A health facility or agency that provides
- 2 services directly to patients or residents and is licensed under
- 3 this article shall adopt a policy describing the rights and

- 1 responsibilities of patients or residents admitted to the health
- 2 facility or agency. Except for a licensed health maintenance
- 3 organization that is subject to chapter 35 of the insurance code of
- 4 1956, 1956 PA 218, MCL 500.3501 to 500.3573, the health facility or
- 5 agency shall post the policy at a public place in the health
- 6 facility or agency and shall provide the policy to each member of
- 7 the health facility or agency staff. Patients—A health facility or
- 8 agency shall treat patients or residents shall be treated in
- 9 accordance with the policy.
- 10 (2) The policy describing the rights and responsibilities of
- 11 patients or residents required under subsection (1) shall must
- 12 include, as a minimum, all of the following:
- 13 (a) A patient or resident shall not be denied appropriate care
- 14 on the basis of race, religion, color, national origin, sex, age,
- 15 disability, marital status, sexual preference, or source of
- 16 payment.
- 17 (b) An individual who is or has been a patient or resident is
- 18 entitled to inspect, or receive for a reasonable fee, a copy of his
- 19 or her the patient's or resident's medical record upon on request
- 20 in accordance with the medical records access act, 2004 PA 47, MCL
- 21 333.26261 to 333.26271. Except as otherwise permitted or required
- 22 under the health insurance portability and accountability act of
- 23 1996, Public Law 104-191, or regulations promulgated under that
- 24 act, 45 CFR parts 160 and 164, a third party shall must not be
- 25 given a copy of the patient's or resident's medical record without
- 26 prior authorization of the patient or resident.
- 27 (c) A patient or resident is entitled to confidential
- 28 treatment of personal and medical records, and may refuse their
- 29 release to a person outside the health facility or agency except as

- 1 required because of a transfer to another health care facility, as
- 2 required by law or third party payment contract, or as permitted or
- 3 required under the health insurance portability and accountability
- 4 act of 1996, Public Law 104-191, or regulations promulgated under
- **5** that act, 45 CFR parts 160 and 164.
- 6 (d) A patient or resident is entitled to privacy, to the
- 7 extent feasible, in treatment and in caring for personal needs with
- 8 consideration, respect, and full recognition of his or her the
- 9 patient's or resident's dignity and individuality.
- 10 (e) A patient or resident is entitled to receive adequate and
- 11 appropriate care, and to receive, from the appropriate individual
- 12 within the health facility or agency, information about his or her
- 13 the patient's or resident's medical condition, proposed course of
- 14 treatment, and prospects for recovery, in terms that the patient or
- 15 resident can understand, unless medically contraindicated as
- 16 documented in the medical record by the attending physician, a
- 17 physician's assistant with whom the physician has a practice
- 18 agreement, or an advanced practice registered nurse.
- 19 (f) A patient or resident is entitled to refuse treatment to
- 20 the extent provided by law and to be informed of the consequences
- 21 of that refusal. If Subject to this subdivision, if a refusal of
- 22 treatment prevents a health facility or agency or its staff from
- 23 providing appropriate care according to ethical and professional
- 24 standards, the relationship with the patient or resident may be
- 25 terminated upon reasonable notice. If the patient or resident is
- 26 pregnant and in labor at the health facility or agency, the health
- 27 facility or agency shall stabilize the patient or resident before
- 28 terminating the relationship with the patient or resident under
- 29 this subdivision.

- (g) A patient or resident is entitled to exercise his or her 1 rights as a patient or resident and as a citizen, and to this end 2 3 may present grievances or recommend changes in policies and services on behalf of himself or herself the patient or resident or 4 5 others to the health facility or agency staff, to governmental 6 officials, or to another person of his or her the patient's or 7 resident's choice within or outside the health facility or agency, 8 free from restraint, interference, coercion, discrimination, or 9 reprisal. A patient or resident is entitled to information about 10 the health facility's or agency's policies and procedures for 11 initiation, review, and resolution of patient or resident 12 complaints.
 - (h) A patient or resident is entitled to information concerning an experimental procedure proposed as a part of his or her the patient's or resident's care and has the right to refuse to participate in the experimental procedure without jeopardizing his or her the patient's or resident's continuing care.
 - (i) A patient or resident is entitled to receive and examine an explanation of his or her the patient's or resident's bill regardless of the source of payment and to receive, upon request, information relating to financial assistance available through the health facility or agency.
 - (j) A patient or resident is entitled to know who is responsible for and who is providing his or her the patient's or resident's direct care, to receive information concerning his or her the patient's or resident's continuing health needs and alternatives for meeting those needs, and to be involved in his or her the patient's or resident's discharge planning, if appropriate.
 - (k) A patient or resident is entitled to associate and have

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private communications and consultations with his or her the 1 patient's or resident's physician or a physician's assistant with 2 3 whom the physician has a practice agreement, with his or her the 4 patient's or resident's advanced practice registered nurse, with 5 his or her the patient's or resident's attorney, or with any other 6 individual of his or her the patient's or resident's choice and to 7 send and receive personal mail unopened on the same day it is 8 received at the health facility or agency, unless medically 9 contraindicated as documented in the medical record by the 10 attending physician, a physician's assistant with whom the 11 physician has a practice agreement, or an advanced practice registered nurse. A patient's or resident's civil and religious 12 liberties, including the right to independent personal decisions 13 14 and the right to knowledge of available choices, shall must not be 15 infringed and the health facility or agency shall encourage and 16 assist in the fullest possible exercise of these rights. A patient 17 or resident may meet with, and participate in, the activities of 18 social, religious, and community groups at his or her the patient's or resident's discretion, unless medically contraindicated as 19 20 documented in the medical record by the attending physician, a 21 physician's assistant with whom the physician has a practice 22 agreement, or an advanced practice registered nurse. 23 (1) A patient or resident is entitled to be free from mental 24 and physical abuse and from physical and chemical restraints, 25 except those restraints authorized in writing by the attending 26 physician, by a physician's assistant with whom the physician has a 27 practice agreement, or by an advanced practice registered nurse, for a specified and limited time or as are necessitated by an 28 emergency to protect the patient or resident from injury to self or 29

- 1 others, in which case the restraint may only be applied by a
- 2 qualified professional who shall set forth in writing the
- 3 circumstances requiring the use of restraints and who shall
- 4 promptly report the action to the attending physician, physician's
- 5 assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse who authorized the
- 6 restraint. In case of a chemical restraint, the physician, or the
- 7 advanced practice registered nurse who authorized the restraint,
- 8 shall be consulted within 24 hours after the commencement of the
- 9 chemical restraint.
- 10 (m) A patient or resident is entitled to be free from
- 11 performing services for the health facility or agency that are not
- 12 included for therapeutic purposes in the plan of care.
- 13 (n) A patient or resident is entitled to information about the
- 14 health facility or agency rules and regulations affecting patient
- 15 or resident care and conduct.
- 16 (o) A patient or resident is entitled to adequate and
- 17 appropriate pain and symptom management as a basic and essential
- 18 element of his or her the patient's or resident's medical
- 19 treatment.
- 20 (3) The following additional requirements for the policy
- 21 described in subsection (2) apply to licensees under parts 213 and
- **22** 217:
- 23 (a) The policy shall must be provided to each nursing home
- 24 patient or home for the aged resident upon admission, and the staff
- 25 of the facility shall must be trained and involved in the
- 26 implementation of the policy.
- 27 (b) Each nursing home patient may associate and communicate
- 28 privately with persons of his or her the patient's choice.
- 29 Reasonable, regular visiting hours, which shall be are not less

- 1 than 8 hours per day, and which shall take into consideration the
- 2 special circumstances of each visitor, shall must be established
- 3 for patients to receive visitors. A patient may be visited by the
- 4 patient's attorney or by representatives of the departments named
- 5 in section 20156, during other than established visiting hours.
- 6 Reasonable privacy shall must be afforded for visitation of a
- 7 patient who shares a room with another patient. Each patient shall
- 8 must have reasonable access to a telephone. A married nursing home
- 9 patient or home for the aged resident is entitled to meet privately
- 10 with his or her the patient's or resident's spouse in a room that
- 11 ensures privacy. If both spouses are residents in the same
- 12 facility, they are entitled to share a room unless medically
- 13 contraindicated and documented in the medical record by the
- 14 attending physician, a physician's assistant with whom the
- 15 physician has a practice agreement, or an advanced practice
- 16 registered nurse.
- 17 (c) A nursing home patient or home for the aged resident is
- 18 entitled to retain and use personal clothing and possessions as
- 19 space permits, unless to do so would infringe upon the rights of
- 20 other patients or residents, or unless medically contraindicated as
- 21 documented in the medical record by the attending physician, a
- 22 physician's assistant with whom the physician has a practice
- 23 agreement, or an advanced practice registered nurse. Each nursing
- 24 home patient or home for the aged resident shall must be provided
- 25 with reasonable space. At the request of a patient, a nursing home
- 26 shall provide for the safekeeping of personal effects, money, and
- 27 other property of a patient in accordance with section 21767,
- 28 except that a nursing home is not required to provide for the
- 29 safekeeping of a property that would impose an unreasonable burden

- 1 on the nursing home.
- (d) A nursing home patient or home for the aged resident is 2 3 entitled to the opportunity to participate in the planning of his or her the patient's or resident's medical treatment. The attending 4 physician, a physician's assistant with whom the physician has a 5 6 practice agreement, or an advanced practice registered nurse, shall 7 fully inform the nursing home patient of the patient's medical 8 condition unless medically contraindicated as documented in the 9 medical record by a physician, a physician's assistant with whom 10 the physician has a practice agreement, or an advanced practice 11 registered nurse. Each A nursing home patient shall must be afforded the opportunity to discharge himself or herself the 12 13 patient from the nursing home.
 - (e) A home for the aged resident may be transferred or discharged only for medical reasons, for his or her the resident's welfare or that of other residents, or for nonpayment of his or her the resident's stay, except as provided by title XVIII or title XIX. A nursing home patient may be transferred or discharged only as provided in sections 21773 to 21777. A nursing home patient or home for the aged resident is entitled to be given reasonable advance notice to ensure orderly transfer or discharge. Those actions shall must be documented in the patient's or resident's medical record.
 - (f) A nursing home patient or home for the aged resident is entitled to be fully informed before or at the time of admission and during stay of services available in the facility, and of the related charges including any charges for services not covered under title XVIII, or not covered by the facility's basic per diem rate. The statement of services provided by the facility shall must

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- be in writing and shall—include those required to be offered on an
 as-needed basis.
- (g) A nursing home patient or home for the aged resident is 3 entitled to manage his or her the patient's or resident's own 4 5 financial affairs, or to have at least a quarterly accounting of 6 personal financial transactions undertaken in his or her the 7 patient's or resident's behalf by the facility during a period of 8 time the patient or resident has delegated those responsibilities 9 to the facility. In addition, a patient or resident is entitled to 10 receive each month from the facility an itemized statement setting 11 forth the services paid for by or on behalf of the patient or resident and the services rendered by the facility. The admission 12 of a patient to a nursing home does not confer on the nursing home 13 14 or its owner, administrator, employees, or representatives the

authority to manage, use, or dispose of a patient's property.

- (h) A nursing home patient or a person authorized by the patient in writing may inspect and copy the patient's personal and medical records. The records shall must be made available for inspection and copying by the nursing home within a reasonable time, not exceeding 1 week, after the receipt of a written request.
- (i) If a nursing home patient desires treatment by a licensed member of the healing arts, the treatment shall must be made available unless it is medically contraindicated, and the medical contraindication is justified in the patient's medical record by the attending physician, a physician's assistant with whom the physician has a practice agreement, or an advanced practice registered nurse.
- (j) A nursing home patient has the right to have his or herthe patient's parents, if a minor, or his or her the patient's or

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- 1 resident's spouse, next of kin, or patient's representative, if an
- 2 adult, stay at the facility 24 hours a day if the patient is
- 3 considered terminally ill by the physician responsible for the
- 4 patient's care, a physician's assistant with whom the physician has
- 5 a practice agreement, or an advanced practice registered nurse.
- 6 (k) Each nursing home patient shall must be provided with
- 7 meals that meet the recommended dietary allowances for that
- 8 patient's age and sex and that may be modified according to special
- 9 dietary needs or ability to chew.
- 10 (l) Each nursing home patient has the right to receive
- 11 representatives of approved organizations as provided in section
- **12** 21763.
- 13 (4) A nursing home, its owner, administrator, employee, or
- 14 representative shall not discharge, harass, or retaliate or
- 15 discriminate against a patient because the patient has exercised a
- 16 right protected under this section.
- 17 (5) In the case of a nursing home patient, the rights
- 18 enumerated in subsection (2)(c), (g), and (k) and subsection
- 19 (3)(d), (g), and (h) may be exercised by the patient's
- 20 representative.
- 21 (6) A nursing home patient or home for the aged resident is
- 22 entitled to be fully informed, as evidenced by the patient's or
- 23 resident's written acknowledgment, before or at the time of
- 24 admission and during stay, of the policy required by this section.
- 25 The policy shall must provide that if a patient or resident is
- 26 adjudicated incompetent and not restored to legal capacity, the
- 27 rights and responsibilities set forth in this section shall must be
- 28 exercised by a person designated by the patient or resident. The
- 29 health facility or agency shall provide proper forms for the

- 1 patient or resident to provide for the designation of this person
- 2 at the time of admission.
- 3 (7) This section does not prohibit a health facility or agency
- 4 from establishing and recognizing additional patients' rights.
- 5 (8) As used in this section:
- **6** (a) "Advanced practice registered nurse" means that term as
- 7 defined in section 17201.
- 8 (b) "Patient's representative" means that term as defined in
- **9** section 21703.
- 10 (c) "Practice agreement" means an agreement described in
- 11 section 17047, 17547, or 18047.
- 12 (d) "Title XVIII" means title XVIII of the social security
- 13 act, 42 USC 1395 to 1395*lll*.
- 14 (e) "Title XIX" means title XIX of the social security act, 42
- 15 USC 1396 to 1396w-5.1396w-8.
- 16 Sec. 21513. The owner, operator, and governing body of a
- 17 hospital licensed under this article:
- 18 (a) Are responsible for all phases of the operation of the
- 19 hospital, selection of the medical staff, and quality of care
- 20 rendered in the hospital.
- 21 (b) Shall cooperate with the department in the enforcement of
- 22 this part, and require that the physicians, dentists, and other
- 23 personnel working in the hospital who are required to be licensed
- 24 or registered are in fact currently licensed or registered.
- 25 (c) Shall ensure that physicians and dentists admitted to
- 26 practice in the hospital are granted hospital privileges consistent
- 27 with their individual training, experience, and other
- 28 qualifications.
- 29 (d) Shall ensure that physicians and dentists admitted to

- 1 practice in the hospital are organized into a medical staff to
- 2 enable an effective review of the professional practices in the
- 3 hospital for the purpose of reducing morbidity and mortality and
- 4 improving the care provided in the hospital for patients. The
- 5 review must include the quality and necessity of the care provided
- 6 and the preventability of complications and deaths occurring in the
- 7 hospital.
- 8 (e) Shall not discriminate because of race, religion, color,
- 9 national origin, age, or sex in the operation of the hospital
- 10 including employment, patient admission and care, room assignment,
- 11 and professional or nonprofessional selection and training
- 12 programs, and shall not discriminate in the selection and
- 13 appointment of individuals to the physician staff of the hospital
- 14 or its training programs on the basis of licensure or registration
- 15 or professional education as doctors of medicine, osteopathic
- 16 medicine and surgery, or podiatry. As used in this subdivision,
- 17 "sex" includes, but is not limited to, pregnancy or lactating
- 18 status.
- 19 (f) Shall ensure that the hospital adheres to medical control
- 20 authority protocols according to section 20918.
- 21 (g) Shall ensure that the hospital develops and maintains a
- 22 plan for biohazard detection and handling.
- 23 (h) Shall notify the department of health and human services
- 24 if the owner, operator, or governing body of the hospital applies
- 25 for designation as a rural emergency hospital.
- 26 Sec. 21537. (1) Beginning January 1, 2026, a hospital shall
- 27 demonstrate to the department, in a form and manner required by the
- 28 department, that the hospital has a policy that complies with all
- 29 of the following:

- 1 (a) Subject to subsection (2) and unless otherwise prohibited
- 2 by law, allows a patient who is giving birth to have, at a minimum,
- 3 the following present with the patient from the time the patient is
- 4 admitted to the hospital and throughout the duration of the
- 5 patient's stay in the hospital:
- 6 (i) If the patient has a partner or a spouse, both of the
- 7 following:
- 8 (A) The partner or spouse.
- 9 (B) A doula.
- 10 (ii) If the patient does not have a partner or spouse or the
- 11 patient's partner or spouse is not available, both of the
- 12 following:
- 13 (A) A doula.
- 14 (B) A companion of the patient.
- 15 (b) Provides the hospital's policy on receiving informed
- 16 consent from the patient.
- 17 (c) Provides the hospital's process for receiving a pregnant
- 18 patient's information from a health professional who initiates the
- 19 transfer of the patient's care to the hospital. If the health
- 20 professional initiating the transfer is a midwife, the process must
- 21 require the hospital to accept the standard form described in
- 22 section 17107, if the form is provided to the hospital for the
- 23 patient, or accept any information that the midwife is required to
- 24 provide to the hospital pursuant to rules promulgated under section
- 25 17117. If the health professional initiating the transfer is a
- 26 certified nurse midwife, the process must require the hospital to
- 27 accept any information that the certified nurse midwife provides.
- 28 (2) Subject to subsection (3), a hospital may limit or
- 29 otherwise exclude an individual from being present with a patient

- 1 described in subsection (1) under any of the following
- 2 circumstances:
- 3 (a) Any of the following apply that require limiting or 4 excluding the individual:
- 5 (i) A declared public health emergency.
- 6 (ii) A public health risk.
- 7 (iii) An infection control risk.
- 8 (b) The individual assaults another individual on the premises
 9 of the hospital.
- 10 (c) Any other circumstance exists in which the hospital
 11 determines that limiting or excluding the individual is necessary
 12 to protect public health or safety or to protect the health or
 13 safety of 1 or more individuals on the premises of the hospital.
- 14 (3) If a hospital limits or otherwise excludes an individual
 15 who is a doula from being present under subsection (2), the
 16 hospital shall document the reason for the doula's exclusion and
 17 allow for an alternative individual who would not otherwise be
 18 excluded under subsection (2) to be present with the patient.
- 19 (4) The department may promulgate rules to implement this 20 section.
- 21 (5) As used in this section:
- 22 (a) "Certified nurse midwife" means an individual who is 23 licensed as a registered professional nurse under part 172 who has 24 been granted a specialty certification in the health profession 25 specialty field of nurse midwifery by the Michigan board of nursing 26 under section 17210.
- 27 (b) "Doula" means an individual who provides nonclinical
 28 physical, emotional, and informational support to an individual who
 29 is pregnant before, during, and after the individual's pregnancy.

- 1 (c) "Health professional" means an individual who is licensed,
- 2 registered, or otherwise authorized to engage in a health
- 3 profession under article 15.
- 4 (d) "Midwife" means that term as defined in section 17101.
