

SENATE BILL NO. 42

February 04, 2025, Introduced by Senators ALBERT, LINDSEY, RUNESTAD, DALEY, THEIS, BELLINO, HOITENGA and HAUCK and referred to Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to create the immigration and customs enforcement support fund; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state and local governmental officers and entities.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. This act may be cited as the "enforcement support fund
2 act".

3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:

4 (a) "Department" means the department of treasury.

5 (b) "Enforcement program" means program as that term is
6 defined in the immigration and customs enforcement support act.

1 (c) "Fund" means the immigration and customs enforcement
2 support fund created in section 3.

3 (d) "Law enforcement agency" means that term as defined in the
4 immigration and customs enforcement support act.

5 (e) "Law enforcement officer" means that term as defined in
6 the immigration and customs enforcement support act.

7 Sec. 3. (1) The immigration and customs enforcement support
8 fund is created within the state treasury.

9 (2) The state treasurer may receive money or other assets from
10 any source. The state treasurer shall direct the investment of the
11 fund. The state treasurer shall credit to the fund interest and
12 earnings from fund investments.

13 (3) Money in the fund at the close of the fiscal year must
14 remain in the fund and not lapse to the general fund.

15 (4) The department is the administrator of the fund for
16 auditing purposes.

17 Sec. 5. (1) Money in the fund may be used for the
18 implementation and enforcement of the immigration and customs
19 enforcement support act, including the administrative costs
20 associated with implementing the immigration and customs
21 enforcement support act.

22 (2) By December 31, 2025, the department shall post
23 instructions for law enforcement agencies to apply for a grant from
24 the fund. The department shall post the instructions required under
25 this subsection on a publicly available website.

26 (3) A law enforcement agency may submit an application for a
27 grant under this section to the department no later than March 15
28 each year. The department shall make a grant award under this
29 section no later than May 1 of each year.

1 (4) The department shall comply with all of the following in
2 awarding a grant under this section:

3 (a) The department shall first award grants sufficient to
4 allow each law enforcement agency to train 3 law enforcement
5 officers to participate in an enforcement program or to provide
6 immigration enforcement assistance through a subsequent program to
7 an enforcement program.

8 (b) After the department has made awards under subdivision
9 (a), the department may award a grant to a law enforcement agency
10 to train additional law enforcement officers. A grant awarded under
11 this subdivision must be based on the proportion of the population
12 the law enforcement agency serves compared to the population served
13 by other law enforcement agencies.

14 (c) After the department has made grant awards under
15 subdivisions (a) and (b), the department may award a law
16 enforcement agency an additional grant of not more than \$15,000.00
17 for each law enforcement officer to provide an incentive to that
18 law enforcement officer to participate in an enforcement program.

19 Enacting section 1. This act does not take effect unless
20 Senate Bill No. 43 of the 103rd Legislature is enacted into law.
