June 11, 2025, Introduced by Senators SANTANA and HERTEL and referred to Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

by amending section 17744b (MCL 333.17744b), as amended by 2019 PA 36.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 17744b. (1) Notwithstanding any provision of this act to
- 2 the contrary, a prescriber may, subject to subsection (2), issue a
- 3 prescription for and a dispensing prescriber or pharmacist may
- 4 dispense an opioid antagonist to any of the following:
- 5 (a) An individual patient at risk of experiencing an opioid-

- 1 related overdose.
- 2 (b) A family member, friend, or other individual in a position
- 3 to assist an individual at risk of experiencing an opioid-related
- 4 overdose.
- 5 (c) A person other than an individual that meets all of the
- 6 following requirements:
- 7 (i) Acts at the direction of the prescriber or dispensing
- 8 prescriber.
- 9 (ii) Upon receipt of an opioid antagonist, stores the opioid
- 10 antagonist in compliance with this part.
- 11 (iii) Dispenses or administers an opioid antagonist under a
- 12 valid prescription issued to an individual or a patient.
- 13 (iv) Performs the requirements under this subsection without
- 14 charge or compensation.
- 15 (d) An agency authorized to purchase, possess, and distribute
- 16 an opioid antagonist under the administration of opioid antagonists
- 17 act, 2019 PA 39, MCL 15.671 to 15.677.
- 18 (2) Notwithstanding any provision of this act to the contrary,
- 19 a prescriber who issues a prescription to a patient for an opioid
- 20 shall, at that time, also issue the patient a prescription for an
- 21 opioid antagonist. A dispensing prescriber or pharmacist may
- 22 dispense the opioid antagonist to the patient.
- 23 (3) (2) When issuing a prescription for or dispensing an
- 24 opioid antagonist as authorized under this section to an agency
- 25 described in subsection (1)(d) or a person other than a patient,
- 26 the prescriber, dispensing prescriber, or pharmacist, as
- 27 appropriate, shall insert the name of the agency or the person as
- 28 the name of the patient.
- 29 (4) (3)—Notwithstanding any provision of this act to the

- contrary, a person that is acting in good faith and with reasonablecare may possess and dispense an opioid antagonist.
- 3 (5) (4)—Notwithstanding any provision of this act to the
 4 contrary, an employee or agent of an agency described in subsection
 5 (1) (d) may, subject to section 105 of the administration of opioid
 6 antagonists act, 2019 PA 39, MCL 15.675, possess and administer an
 7 opioid antagonist dispensed to the agency under this section.
- 8 (6) (5)—A prescriber who issues a prescription for or a 9 dispensing prescriber or pharmacist who dispenses an opioid 10 antagonist as authorized under this section is not liable in a 11 civil action for a properly stored and dispensed opioid antagonist 12 that was a proximate cause of injury or death to an individual due 13 to the administration of or failure to administer the opioid 14 antagonist.
