A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1278 (MCL 380.1278), as amended by 2016 PA 170, and by adding sections 1164, 1164a, 1164c, 1164d, 1164e, 1164f, and 1164g.

Sec. 1278. (1) In addition to the requirements for 1 accreditation under section 1280 specified in that section, if the 2 board of a school district wants all of the schools of the school 3 district to be accredited under section 1280, the board shall 4 provide to all pupils attending public school in the district a 5 6 core academic curriculum in compliance with subsection (3) in each 7 of the curricular areas specified in the state board recommended 8 model core academic curriculum content standards developed under 9 subsection (2). The state board model core academic curriculum 10 content standards shall must encompass academic and cognitive 11 instruction only. For purposes of this section, the state board model core academic curriculum content standards shall must not 12 include attitudes, beliefs, or value systems that are not essential 13 14 in the legal, economic, and social structure of our society and to 15 the personal and social responsibility of citizens of our society. 16 (2) Recommended model core academic curriculum content standards shall must be developed and periodically updated by the 17 18 state board, shall must be in the form of knowledge and skill 19 content standards that are recommended as state standards for 20 adoption by public schools in local curriculum formulation and adoption, and shall must be distributed to each school district in 21 the state. The recommended model core academic curriculum content 22 23 standards shall must set forth desired learning objectives in math, science, reading, history, geography, economics, American 24 25 government, and writing for all children at each stage of schooling 26 and be based upon on the "Michigan K-12 Program Standards of 27 Quality" to ensure that high academic standards, academic skills, 28 and academic subject matters are built into the instructional goals 29 of all school districts for all children. The state board shall

- 13 testing only for proficiency in basic and advanced academic skills
- 14 and academic subject matter, and are not used to measure pupils'
- 15 values or attitudes.
- 16 (3) The board of each school district, considering academic
- 17 curricular objectives defined and recommended pursuant to
- 18 subsection (2), shall do both of the following:
- 19 (a) Establish a core academic curriculum for its pupils at the
- 20 elementary, middle, and secondary school levels. The core academic
- 21 curriculum shall must define academic objectives to be achieved by
- 22 all pupils and shall must be based upon on the school district's
- 23 educational mission, long-range pupil goals, and pupil performance
- 24 objectives. The core academic curriculum may vary from the model
- 25 core academic curriculum content standards recommended by the state
- 26 board pursuant to subsection (2).
- 27 (b) After consulting with teachers and school building
- 28 administrators, determine the aligned instructional program for
- 29 delivering the core academic curriculum and identify the courses

- 1 and programs in which the core academic curriculum will be taught.
- 2 (4) The board may supplement the core academic curriculum by3 providing instruction through additional classes and programs.
- 4 (5) For all pupils, the subjects or courses, and the delivery 5 of those including special assistance, that constitute the 6 curriculum the pupils engage in shall assure must ensure the pupils 7 have a realistic opportunity to learn all subjects and courses required by the district's core academic curriculum. A subject or 8 9 course required by the core academic curriculum pursuant to 10 subsection (3) shall must be provided to all pupils in the school 11 district by a school district, a consortium of school districts, or 12 a consortium of 1 or more school districts and 1 or more 13 intermediate school districts.
 - (6) To the extent practicable, the state board may adopt or develop academic objective-oriented high standards for knowledge and life skills, and a recommended core academic curriculum, for special education pupils for whom it may not be realistic or desirable to expect achievement of initial mastery of the state board recommended model core academic content standards objectives or of a high school diploma.
 - (7) The state board shall make available to all nonpublic schools in this state, as a resource for their consideration, the model core academic curriculum content standards developed for public schools pursuant to subsection (2) for the purpose of assisting the governing body of a nonpublic school in developing its core academic curriculum.
- (8) Excluding special education pupils, pupils having a
 learning disability, and pupils with extenuating circumstances as
 determined by school officials, a pupil who does not score

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- 1 satisfactorily on the fourth or seventh grade state assessment
- 2 program reading test shall must be provided special assistance
- 3 reasonably expected to enable the pupil to bring his or her the
- 4 pupil's reading skills to grade level within 12 months.
- 5 (9) Any course that would have been considered a nonessential
- 6 elective course under Snyder v Charlotte School Dist, Snyder v
- 7 Charlotte School Dist, 421 Mich 517 (1984), on April 13, 1990 shall
- 8 must continue to be offered to resident pupils of nonpublic schools
- 9 on a shared time basis.
- 10 (10) As used in this section, "Armenian Genocide", "genocide",
- 11 and "Holocaust" mean those terms as defined in section 1168.
